FROM THE PASTOR ...

Friends – This is a reprise of a Beacon article I wrote for Christmas a few years ago. I believe it says all I would hope to say this year too so here it is once more...

"Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. Matthew 1:18

Thus begins Matthew's version of the Christmas story. It starts at verse 18 rather than verse 1 because Matthew opens the story with a long genealogy that links Jesus directly to King David and then all the way back to Abraham. Matthew's version of the nativity story is short and to the point. It takes all of seven verses, if you don't include the story of the three kings. The other version of Jesus' birth appears in the Gospel of Luke. Once again though, the story does not begin in the first verse of the first chapter. Instead, Luke begins the actual birth narrative in the first verse of the second chapter because he uses the entire first chapter to set the stage for Jesus. First he describes the birth of John the Baptist to Zechariah and Elizabeth and then he goes on to tell the beautiful story of the Annunciation to Mary by the Angel Gabriel and the Magnificat, Mary's response to Gabriel, which follows.

The story we think of as the Nativity Story is actually a composite of these two stories from Matthew and Luke but we seldom stop to consider that little tidbit. Instead, we think of the Angel appearing to the terrified young Mary and then we leap to the long journey to Bethlehem, Mary clinging to the back of a donkey with ever patient Joseph trudging alongside. Before we know it the newborn Babe is safely snuggled into the straw filled manger surrounded by smiling animals, his beatific mother and strong yet gentle father hovering nearby. Then the shepherds stumble over themselves in their hurry to see firsthand the miracle the angels sang to them in sheep dotted fields. They are soon on their way only to be replaced by the royal entourage of three kings arriving on camels, laden with gifts. This is the Christmas story we know and love. We don't worry about the details and whether or not we have the timing and the details right. We just know this is Christmas. This is our Christmas story and it's what draws us to church during this time of year. This is *the* Christmas story – the real Christmas story which is not the Christmas story society tells or understands. Society tells us over and over again that Christmas is about twinkling lights, garish plastic lawn displays, and buying stuff, lots and lots of stuff - everything from a Mercedes sports car to Imagination Elmo. But we know that is not Christmas. Not really. Not ever.

Dear friends, we know the real story of Christmas. We know the truth of Christmas – that God loves us so much that God sent his own dear Son to live among us as flesh and blood. We know that Christmas is not about stuff. Christmas is about new beginnings for us all as we celebrate God's light and truth and hope breaking into the world all over again this Advent Season. May you claim the Christmas story as your own once more this Advent Season. May you revel in its details and luxuriate in the love of God it makes tangible in every telling. May you make the time to kneel at the manger once more, amazed and humbled by all that God has done, is doing, and will do in your life, if only you will make room in your heart for God.

Merry Christmas and the Happiest of New Years to you and all your loved ones.



The Christmas Offerings

Each year our church actually receives two different and distinct Christmas offerings so we thought it might be helpful to explain as clearly as we can the purpose of each.

The Christmas Offering is an annual offering intended for the church itself for our officers to use as they see fit with the fiscal year coming to an end. You could actually think of this offering as a sort of Christmas gift to the church. Friends and visitors often make contributions through this offering but anyone is welcome to contribute.

The Christmas Fund is a designated offering received on behalf of the national church. It is used specifically to offset the small pensions of clergy who have spent their careers serving either as missionaries or in small, poor churches in the United States which were unable to fund a regular pension for them. It also goes to fund an "emergency fund" created to provide emergency financial assistance to retired clergy encountering special circumstances for which their financial reserves are inadequate.

Offering envelopes for both of these are available in the sanctuary for those of you receiving the Beacon electronically. These envelopes can be placed in the offering plates during any of our worship services between now and the end of December. Please know that your gifts in any amount for one or both of these two offerings are deeply appreciated. They do make a difference, here in our own church and literally across the breadth of the entire denomination.
