#### FROM THE PASTOR ...

Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

1 Corinthians 13:7

February is here so I just put my Valentine's Day door decoration on my front door. It's the word "LOVE" carved from wood, painted various shades of pink and red and decorated with little hearts. Sort of schmaltzy and cliché, I know, but I like it. I like the idea of proclaiming "love" to all my neighbors. I like claiming my home as one where love rules, at least most of the time. Of course, not every day in my house is filled with love. Some days my family drives me crazy and other days the neighbors make me nuts. But, such is life, isn't it? We aspire to love and be loved. We aspire to respond to life around us as loving, kind people. We want to be loving, bearing with those things our loved ones do or say that make us crazy. We want to believe the best about people. We want to be able to keep on hoping everything will somehow work out when life feels upside down. We want to think we can endure whatever fate throws at us, but some days that's easier to do than others. The truth is that sometimes love seems an impossible dream, a romantic fairy tale with little grounding in everyday life.

Not so, says the Apostle Paul in the first of his letters to the church in Corinth. Love, Paul argues, is actually the very foundation on which life each day is built. Fancy words and profound pronouncements do not make love happen. Giving away your wealth and even your life, that doesn't prove you know how to love. What you do in your relationships with other people – those you know well and those who are strangers encountered in a moment – how you treat all those people is the only thing that reveals whether or not you know how to love. "Love is patient ... and kind," Paul says. "Love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude ... does not insist on its own way... is not irritable or resentful ... does not rejoice in wrong-doing, but rejoices in truth." Admittedly Paul sets a pretty high bar here. None of us is always patient and kind. None of us escapes those moments of envy or arrogance. And there is no one who doesn't have the occasional moment of irritability and selfishness. Of course not, because we are all human. Paul gets this, and Paul wants us to realize that in spite of how imperfectly we love, that ability to love is still the most precious gift from God in our lives. He wants us to understand that we are able to love because God first loved us, so much that God sent Jesus to teach us how to love as God would have us love.

That's why I think it is no surprise whatsoever that one of the signature community events of this church is the Valentine Tea. Valentine's Day is about love, after all. This church understands love, living out Paul's description of love in 1 Corinthians all the time through the actions of our members and friends as they care for each other and for the needs of our community at large. This church gets love. This church does love and soon we will broaden and deepen that love even more as we prepare to engage in the process which will lead us to become an Open and Affirming Congregation of the United Church of Christ. Every week as worship begins the Deacon states, "no matter who you are or where you are on your journey of life you are welcome here." The ONA process and the act of becoming an official ONA church takes that statement from words to action, as we claim our call to be a radically welcoming church – one where everyone is welcome to worship and work together as best as they are able. ONA means, in essence, that we put no limits on love. We aspire to love as God loves us – freely and without reservation or restriction. Can we do this? I have no doubt since we are doing it already. Plus, as our good friend Paul

reminds us, "faith, hope and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love." We got this, no problem.

#### IN THE SPOTLIGHT!



Congratulations to our own *Jamie Foster* who will be volunteering once again to prepare taxes for folks in our community through the WARM Center. Jamie is very excited about being able to do this work she loves and sends the following information to her church family:

I will be scheduled there on Fridays and occasionally on Saturdays, starting February 10<sup>th</sup>. This is a completely free service to anyone with household income of \$50,000 or less. However, I have bent the rules slightly over the previous years and prepared returns for people slightly over the threshold by discretion only (I am hoping the new site coordinator will be willing to work with me so I can provide as much service as possible). And, the more 'complicated' the return, the more fun I have. There is no intimidation at the WARM shelter. If anyone is interested, all they need to do is call the Warm Shelter, extension 108 and talk to Harlee the site coordinator to make an appointment! To my knowledge. there are two other volunteers, plus Harlee, and the service is available 5-6 days a week until April 15<sup>th</sup>.
