FROM THE PASTOR

"...beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." Philippians 8:4

Some of you may recognize in the above words a benediction that I offer from time to time, giving full credit to its author the Apostle Paul. These beautiful, inspiring words seem to me to be the best possible framework for us to use as we continue the life, work and ministry of this church and ourselves in a new year. I must admit though that the notion that 2017 is about to begin is mindboggling. Wasn't it just 2016? How is it possible that another year is ending, a new one beginning? Time is relentless.

"Before the hills in order stood, or earth received her frame, from everlasting thou art God, to endless years the same." So goes the third verse of one of my favorite hymns – O God Our Help in Ages Past. This hymn gives voice to the eternal nature of the passage of time, reminding everyone who sings it that though time passes and life changes, God is ever the same. God is timeless. This is not easy! It takes real effort and hard work. None of this just falls in our laps. It requires vigilance and perseverance, commitment and dedication.

This is the role and purpose of the church. The church is where we come to learn about God and God's expectations of us and hopes for us. The church is where we come to experience the new life possible in Jesus. The church is where we gather to celebrate the incredible new possibilities revealed by the Holy Spirit in our midst. The church is where we come to discover together how to be the best "us" we can be as God's Beloved Community of the faithful. We already know this. We already do this. That's why I am so excited for 2017 to begin. It's going to be a great year in the life of our church, I know. So, what are you hoping we can accomplish in our church in 2017?
