FROM THE PASTOR ...

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Psalm 51:10

By the time you receive this, Lent will already have begun. Ash Wednesday will have come and gone, the ashen crosses on foreheads and hands no longer visible. Hopefully, though, the marks of those ashen crosses will still be present in the hearts and heads of those who received them, and even those who didn't. That's what Ash Wednesday offers – a chance to begin the process of accepting God's mark of ashes to show you are hoping to try to be who God invites you to be. Ashes are a sign of humility, a sign that none of us are free from the inevitable shortcomings of human nature, what we think of as "sin." Ashes are God's invitation to rejoice in knowing that a better you is not only possible, it's what God has in mind for you.

Ash Wednesday was not part of my religious upbringing in the little Presbyterian church of my childhood. Presbyterians, at least in the 1960's", just didn't "do" Ash Wednesday. I never did hear a satisfactory explanation as to why other than a few vague comments that Ash Wednesday was for Catholics. Certainly Ash Wednesday was one day when it was easy to tell at school who was Catholic and who wasn't. I remember feeling left

out when so many of my friends and teachers had those sooty smudges on their foreheads. I asked my mother what they were and she explained it to me. And then she did something else that in hindsight amazes me. She took me to the Lutheran Church in town which also observed Ash Wednesday. Their service was in the evening and we went and sat in the back. That pastor had an incredible voice and I remember him singing parts of the service so powerfully that I literally had goosebumps. I was also deeply moved by the focus on admitting that everyone falls short of God's expectations but God loves us anyway. I understood forgiveness in a whole new way after attending that long ago service and, looking back, it is probably one of those moments that set me on the path to being your pastor.

Those Ash Wednesday ashes still matter to me. They represent this unique opportunity every Lent to focus on my relationship to God and to Jesus. Those ashes invite me to listen more deeply to Jesus' advice for living my life. Those ashes, given out accompanied by the words, "remember mortal that you are dust and unto dust you will return" are a powerful, soul marking reminder that life right here and right now is all I have to put into practice God's hopes and dreams for my life. And so it is for all of us.

That's why I invite each of you to consider Ash Wednesday, however you observed it, as the first step on your Lenten journey this year. We will have other ways for you to make the most of that journey including a daily Lenten Devotional Guide and a weekly Lenten Bible Study offered at the church every Thursday morning at 11am in the Parlor. A unique twist to this is that the opportunity to participate online will also be available to anyone interested. Conversations about our ONA process will be another option for reflection this Lenten season as will the opportunity to use the Family Housing Support collection boxes as a Lenten discipline. The "Fill the Pews" March Madness Missions Project also makes a return as a way to remind ourselves to share of our own bounty with those in need and our own faith with those who wonder why it matters so much to us.

Lent is here, dear friends, and with it a unique opportunity to reflect on who you are and who you want to be, informed by God's love for you no matter what. However you choose to make your way through Lent this year, know that your church

is here, ready, willing and able to be with you on the journey.

Notes from the TRUSTEES

Good news: We are putting out *Phase 2 flat roof installation* as part of our 3-year Capital Campaign. This will cover the roof over the offices to the Sanctuary doors and the south and west sides of the Sanctuary. Stayed tuned as bids are received, reviewed by the Trustees and a contract awarded. We hope to have the work started by April.

We are slowly replacing the *light bulbs* throughout the church with LED (Light Emitting Diode) bulbs. These are more efficient than the CFL (Compact Fluorescent Lamp) bulbs and should help reduce our electric bill. As a result there are a significant number of working light bulbs that we want to offer to the friends of the church. There are a variety of bulbs on a table in Fellowship Hall. Please help yourself and leave a contribution if you so desire in the basket.

<u>Bad news</u>: We were hit this week with a \$1400 bill to clear out the sewer pipes to the septic system. No damage was done to the facility but it was a costly repair. Please do not flush anything other than toilet paper. The sewer pipes are cast iron and have a rough surface and are especially susceptible to clogging from anything other than toilet paper.
