FROM THE PASTOR ...

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth. Do you not perceive it?" Isaiah 43:19

This text from Isaiah is probably one of the more well-known verses from the writings of this extraordinary Old Testament prophet. In fact, the book of Isaiah was written by several people, spanning hundreds of years in its descriptions of and reactions to what was happening in the lives of the Israelites in the wake of the destruction of Jerusalem and the Babylonian captivity. Given this context, it is not surprising that the book of Isaiah is an extraordinary repository of hope. Isaiah notes the terrible sufferings of God's people over and over again. He gives voice to their anger toward their enemies and their incredible frustration that life was not at all what they expected or wanted. But, most of all, Isaiah comes back over and over again to hope. God for Isaiah was always the source of unending hope and steadfast love. He reminded the people, and he reminds us, over and over again that God remains always alive, always concerned about the lives of God's people as

they are unfolding in real time. God never leaves us abandoned or forgotten. Rather, God is always calling us forward into the new possibilities always emerging in God's everchanging world.


