FROM THE PASTOR ...

"Where can I go from your spirit? Or where can I flee from your presence?" Psalm 139:7

"If you become a bird and fly away from me," said his mother, "I will be the tree that you come home to." The Runaway Bunny by Margaret Wise Brown

These two quotes are a clue to some of our exciting plans at UCC Westerly for this fall. The first quote is from Psalm 139. This beautiful psalm is intended as a reminder to all that there is no place we can run to where God is not. If we try to run from God intentionally because of our anger and fear or because we're just too busy to pay attention, still God is with us no matter why or when or where we stop running. If our loneliness and frustrations make us feel like God has run away from us, we are assured that this is never the case. Wherever we find ourselves, God is already there. This is exactly the same sentiment we see in the second quote from the beloved children's book, The Runaway Bunny by Margaret Wise Brown. In this classic children's book, memorialized in a statue in Westerly's Wilcox Park, a restless little bunny anxious to be anything but a bunny tells his mother of his plans for a new life. No matter what he proposes, she promises she will already be there to

greet him no matter where he runs or what he becomes. Sound familiar?

Children's books have an amazing capacity to bring the most important of life's lessons down to earth in words and pictures easily understood. That's why this fall in our Sunday morning worship we will be exploring the life wisdom found in children's books. Many of you responded to my request earlier in the summer to share with me your favorite children's books and for that I am very grateful. Our own "Books" group met with me at Misquamicut earlier in August and we spent a lovely evening reading children's books to each other! I am excited about the possibilities this unique foundation offers for our spiritual, missional and fellowship opportunities being planned for this fall. Here's a sampling!

SABBATH CIRCLES is the name given to our new Family Ministries program geared for all ages but with a special emphasis on families with children and youth in their midst. Recognizing that regular Sunday attendance is challenging for young families today, the SABBATH CIRCLES program includes a "home-school" version of Sunday School for older children with a class for little ones offered on Sunday mornings as attendance encourages. The "At Home" curriculum will have a featured theme for the month which will include several Bible stories to be discovered, read and explored by parents and children at home. Accompanying this will be study skill exercises designed to increase familiarity with the Bible itself as well as a variety of other activities to think about the stories through art, crafts and service projects. There will also be monthly conversations with me during Fellowship time one Sunday a month where folks can come and talk about what they are learning in their Bible study at home. Questions encouraged!! Occasional Pot-lucks are part of the plan too!

Another piece of SABBATH CIRCLES will be an intentional pairing up of our families of all sizes and types within the church so that new folks have more seasoned members to connect with and, vice versa. These relationships will be self-chosen, self-directed and rotating throughout the year with the hope that everyone will enjoy this intentional practice of having a "church buddy." Also integral to the program will be missional service projects like WARM CENTER SUNDAY on September 17 and the return of the POLAR FLEECE EXPRESS to Harvest Table on October 18, not to mention on-

going projects connected to the Pollinator Gardens. Lots of exciting stuff for sure!

So, whether or not you are a "runaway bunny", we hope you will find a new point of connection at our church within SABBATH CIRCLES. And, if you like it, we hope you will invite your friends and family to come be part of a circle at UCC Westerly. SABBATH CIRCLES Sunday will be celebrated on September 10 when materials for September and October will be dedicated and you can pick up your copy then. We also hope to have a variety of Bibles available to purchase or borrow for your studies at home. Learning for all ages is encouraged too!

Sound like fun? We hope so! In the words of the runaway bunny as the book ends: "Shucks," said the bunny. "I might just as well stay where I am and be your little bunny." And so he did. "Have a carrot," said the mother bunny. I'll make sure we have plenty of carrots for you AND everyone else too. Hope to see you soon.
