From the Pastor...

"Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." Isaiah 43:18-19

This has always been one of my favorite passages from the book of Isaiah. It comes from what is called Second Isaiah written to address the experiences of the Hebrew people languishing in Babylon after Israel's defeat by the Babylonians. The writer of these incredible words wanted the people to know that God had not forgotten about them or all they had been through. God knew their heartaches and God had heard their cries. More than that, God was going to respond to those cries and lead these people forward into amazing new possibilities they could scarcely imagine. All they needed was to believe in God and trust that God was present in their midst.

I've been thinking a lot about this text from Isaiah as the halfway point of my first year as your pastor stands on the horizon. (*I know, hard to believe, isn't it?*). I see Isaiah's words coming to life in our midst more and more each day which is why I find myself even more excited about our future together than I was when you first welcomed me into your midst. United Congregational is a wonderful church filled with wonderful people. You have faced challenges and joys together and, most importantly, have learned to celebrate both as just part of being together in this community of faith. You have laid a very firm foundation on which we can now build together for the future of this incredible church.

This future we are beginning to build together is what has me so excited. God is indeed doing a new thing here, just like Isaiah described in those beautiful words above. Worship attendance is strong and getting stronger. Folks stay for social time after worship, even when no one has signed up to provide coffee and goodies. Why? Because they *like being here and spending time with each other!* Each of the boards and committees I have met with are responding enthusiastically to the new possibilities we have generated in our times of conversation and pondering. A few examples are worthy of mentioning here as God's new thing begins to take shape in our midst. The Deacons are supporting a once a month midweek service for healing and peace here in June, July and August as part of the "Summer of Peace-Westerly 2012." The Christian Ed Board and Sunday School leadership are planning a "new fashioned" Church Picnic on Sunday, August 26 and are working with me to begin a new family ministries program which will take place one Friday evening each month beginning in September. A special July outing is also in the works to support and celebrate our families with young children. Trustees are hard at work on sprucing up the building and providing the solid financial base we need to move forward into our future with confidence. A technology committee is being formed so that we can work together to maximize our presence on the "web" even as we make more effective use of new technology in the daily operations of the church office. The Stewardship Committee is hard at work creating a series of small group gatherings this fall so we can talk with and get to know each other better. And a new church pictorial directory is in process.

So, when we read those long ago words of Isaiah, we *know* they still apply to us – right here and right now! God *IS* doing a new thing right here at United Congregational Church of Westerly in Pawcatuck! And we get to be a part of it! As I said as I began this article, I'm excited. I hope you are too! I wonder what's going to happen next? I'm so glad we'll be finding out together....

Mission News

The UCC Coffee Project is another name for one of our ongoing missions. You may also know it as Equal Exchange, Fairly Traded. This is the little table where you can purchase coffee, tea, chocolate and other items in Fellowship Hall. Just to let you know, our church and the UCC do not make any profit from these sales; the money from our sales is sent directly to the growers and owners of small farms in Latin America, Africa, Asia, and the U.S. to help them build a better future for themselves and their families. The farmers earn a fair price for their products, have access to affordable credit, and gain a long-term trading partner they can trust.

We have some new products to offer: Organic Camomile Tea, Organic Peppermint Tea, Organic Darjeeling Tea, Organic Espresso Bean Chocolate, and Organic "Mind, Body, and Soul" coffee (medium/Vienna roast). There is a **price-list** at the table. We sell "at cost" with no mark-up.

Every second Sunday is "Mission Sunday." This is always the Sunday that our church sponsors the Westerly WARM Center meal. The boards and committees are assigned a month in the year for this local mission. The WARM Center meal for Sunday, June 10th, is going to be the responsibility of the Women's Fellowship. Watch for more information about what the WARM Center does and specific details on how we help. The Mission Committee has decided to add a food/living supplies offering on each Mission Sunday to better benefit the **Pawcatuck** Neighborhood Center (PNC), our other local mission. Please bring a few items to place in the wicker basket on the floor near the altar. It is our hope that with this monthly ritual, we will remember to generously feed our neighbors. Please note expiration dates on food. Items of particular need are tea, coffee, fruit juice, jams, and jellies. Glass jars are acceptable. The Red Buckets are located in Fellowship Hall by the Mission bulletin board.

We are trying to get a good view of what we already do, as we think about and evolve our mission work in the future.
