From the Pastor...

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." – Matthew 11:28-30

Summer is here at last! As I write this in my office, a crystal clear blue sky proclaims the glory of God's Creation in the midst of a beautiful June afternoon. A gentle breeze ruffles the leaves of the lilac bush just outside my window, undoubtedly planted by one of you in just the right spot for the pastor to enjoy on a day such as this. I treasure that lilac bush for many reasons, not the least of which is that it reminds me every time I look at it of how much you love your church, how much you have done for your church over the years.

Growing a church – *being* a church – is hard work. It is a task that is never done. A church, after all, is God's house and we know there is always something more needing to be done around the house! But we also need to remember the importance of holy rest, Sabbath time. Rest is so integral to our faith that it is part of God's earliest instructions to the Hebrews gathered at the foot of Mt. Sinai who were told in no uncertain terms that the Sabbath was to be honored always.

Jesus understood this need for holy rest and how damaging it is for us when we get stuck in "one more thing" mode for too long. As he addressed the crowds following him, he spoke the words quoted above revealing in them that he understands just how tired people can get. So much of life is hard work, in Jesus' time and in our own. That's why Jesus invites us to come to him in our tiredness, in our weariness and share our burdens with him. That's what yoking is! A yoke shares the load being carried so that the effort required is less for each. That's what Jesus wants us to remember every time we come into the church, Christ's own gathered community. We come here to share and support each other in all the work to be done. That way it's not too much for any of us. So as we enter summer time when life slows down a little even as the beach and the golf course and the fishing rods beckon, I hope you'll find time to join us for worship on at least some of our Sunday mornings. But I also encourage you to make the time for your own holy rest. Take a walk. Sit down in the sun with a good book. Find that perfect bench in Wilcox Park to watch the world walk by. It is in those sacred, unhurried moments when it is easiest to hear God whispering in our ear. It is in those quiet times that we find the renewal we need to be about God's work in the world.

Have a blessed and renewing summer – and get ready for a rocking good time this fall!

This is the little table where you can purchase coffee, tea, chocolate and other items in Fellowship Hall. Just to let you know, our church and the UCC do not make any profit from these sales; the money from our sales is sent directly to the growers and owners of small farms in Latin America, Africa, Asia, and the U.S. to help them build a better future for themselves and their families. The farmers earn a fair price for their products, have access to affordable credit, and gain a long-term trading partner they can trust.

We have some new products to offer: Organic Camomile Tea, Organic Peppermint Tea, Organic Darjeeling Tea, Organic Espresso Bean Chocolate, and Organic "Mind, Body, and Soul" coffee (medium/Vienna roast). There is a **price-list** at the table. We sell "at cost" with no mark-up.

Every second Sunday is "**Mission Sunday**." This is always the Sunday that our church sponsors the Westerly WARM Center meal. The boards and committees are assigned a month in the year for this local mission. The WARM Center meal for Sunday, **July 8th**, is going to be the responsibility of the *Congregation! We will be asking for VOLUNTEERS to give the committee members a break.* The meal for Sunday,

August 12th, is going to be the responsibility of the *Kitchen and Nominating Committees.*

The Mission Committee has decided to add a food/living supplies offering on each Mission Sunday to better benefit the **Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center (PNC)**, our other local mission. Please bring a few items to place in the wicker basket on the floor near the altar. It is our hope that with this monthly ritual, we will remember to generously feed our neighbors. Please note expiration dates on food. <u>Items of particular need</u> are *coffee, fruit juice, canned milk, and mashed potatoes.* Glass jars are acceptable. ICE CARD

Would you be interested in a UCC Westerly ICE card?

Perhaps if you knew what it is, you would be! An ICE card is a wallet size "In Case of Emergency" card which you would keep in your wallet with your medical cards. It provides official written permission, with your signature, for the hospital to call Pastor Ruth if you are admitted to the hospital when you may be unable to give permission yourself. This is very important because the new federal HIPPA regulations forbid the hospital from contacting anyone about you without your permission. These cards would not replace your other emergency contact arrangements with family members. It just gives the hospital permission to notify Pastor Ruth you have been admitted. Blank ICE cards are available on the table outside the sanctuary door which leads to Fellowship Hall. Please speak with Pastor Ruth with any questions you may have about the ICE card.
