From the Pastor...

"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. . . . let your light shine before others, so they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:14-16

One of the little things I so love about our church is our use of the lighthouse "beacon" image. As you walk in the main bell courtyard door, you see a line of lighthouses atop our welcoming display case. Our newsletter is called "The Beacon." To me that means we are claiming our responsibility as a community of Christians to live into Christ's words from Matthew about being the light of the world. At least, we are trying to and it is often not easy.

Being the light of the world is not easy because we know the world is so big and our light shining out from UCC Westerly seems so very small by comparison. But it's not. Not really. Our little light is sort of like a flashlight shining in the dark, guiding its holder to a place of safety where more light abounds. Our little light, when combined with all the little lights of folks in other churches and synagogues and mosques and ashrams around the world, is able to illuminate the whole world. All we need to do is our part -- keeping our light shining brightly, as brightly as we are able, and trust God will handle the rest.

As we have met this fall in Stewardship's "Get Connected" small groups, I have become ever more convinced that our light is poised to shine even more brightly. These gatherings have been invaluable to me as your pastor as you truly connected with me and with each other in new ways. These groups gave rise to so many thoughtful and provocative conversations which in turn gave voice to some incredible new ideas even as tried and true possibilities were revisited and reclaimed. It has become clear to me that UCCW's light has been shining strongly ever since its birth as a uniting congregation almost 50 years ago and that same wonderful, courageous spirit is still alive and well here. We have so much to offer our community and in the coming months we will be deciding together just how to do that. Some of the ideas which have surfaced include creating a community garden on our expansive front lawn to grow vegetables for the food pantry at the PNC; identifying ways to reach out to the Castle Hill community where we are located to remind

them we are their neighborhood church; continuing to expand what we offer for children and families including the possibility of a children's choir; taking trips as a congregation which will widen our horizons even as they deepen our faith and our sense of connection with one another.

Our light on the hill is indeed shining brightly and our future promises even more light to break forth. The real question for you is how you will be a part of this bright and shining future emerging right here in our midst. As you ponder your answer, I leave with you with a new spin on a very old joke – How many UCCW-ers does it take to screw in a light bulb? Who knows? But we're sure gonna find out!!!!
