#### FROM THE PASTOR ....

"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you" Philippians 1:3

November has always been one of my favorite months ever since I was a little girl. Perhaps it's because this is the month of my birthday (although that might be a reason NOT to like it as I seem to get older every year). Perhaps it's because November is when we celebrate two of my favorite holidays – All Saints Day and Thanksgiving.

Yes, All Saints Day is a holiday, at least in the church. Celebrated on the First Sunday in November, All Saints Sunday was originally a remembrance of all saints, living and dead. Today All Saints Sunday is when we remember and honor all of our departed loved ones now in God's nearer presence. Such will be the case in our church on **November 3** when everyone is invited to bring a photo or memento of a departed loved one to worship. You will have the opportunity to add your photo or item to the altar during the service as a part of a liturgy to remember those loved ones now gone even as we honor their continuing importance in our lives. I hope you can join us.

Then, of course, there is Thanksgiving. If ever there was a holiday laden with expectations, this is one of them. All those Norman Rockwell images of the perfectly roasted turkey on a platter being plunked down in the middle of an already sumptuous table dance in our heads, no matter how distant from our reality it may be. Norman Rockwell perfection notwithstanding, I have always loved Thanksgiving. My table is set with my best china, silver and glassware arrayed on my grandmother's white damask tablecloth. Like you, on this day we revel in our own family traditions and recipes unique to us, reminding us of who we really are in the midst of a fragmented world.

One of our traditions, and I am guessing you have a similar one, is to take a moment as the meal begins for each to offer a word of thanks for the blessings of God most on our minds and hearts in that moment. These prayers are usually a reflection of the year just passed since those last Thanksgiving blessings were counted – gratitude for a new job, for renewed health, for exciting prospects, for friendships cherished and family rediscovered. I must confess, while I love Thanksgiving Dinner and all the fixings, it is these moments of prayer together as a family which I treasure most. This is what feels most real, most right, most renewing to me.

So as you anticipate your Thanksgiving this year, however and wherever you will celebrate it, I hope you will take a moment to count your blessings and share them out loud with God and each other. I think you'll find it seasons the meal better than anything else you could add. Oh, and by the way, when I'm counting my blessings, each of you and this wonderful church we love together will be front and center. Have a wonderful holiday.

## **Mission** Memos

Your Missions Committee has been hard at work and has come up with some new projects as well as some new twists on old favorites. Read on!

> WARM Center Meals -- We're sharing the wealth of experiences with everyone instead of just assigning boards and committees to dates so we hope you'll consider how you can support our once a month commitment to provide a WARM Center meal. Here are your options:

- Pull together a group of friends from the church or elsewhere, decide on a month to host and sign up on the sheet in Fellowship Hall. You then either prepare a meal for 50 OR provide the ingredients for a meal for 50 OR provide funding for a meal in the form of a check or cash. Note that if you are providing either an entire prepared meal or the ingredients for a meal, you are responsible for delivery of the meal/ingredients to the WARM Center on Spruce Street on the Sunday it is due. Cash donations need to be provided to WARM by no later than Friday preceding the Sunday so there is sure to be a meal available that day.
- Support our own monthly Deacons Fund Emergency Fund Special Offering on Communion Sundays because the Deacons have agreed to provide funding for any months in which no one signs up to host or sponsor the meal beginning in January 2014.

**REMINDER:** The **WARM CENTER meal** for Sunday, **November 10<sup>th</sup>** is going to be the responsibility of the **Christian Ed Board**. For **December 8<sup>th</sup>** – the **Mission Committee**.
