FROM THE PASTOR

"For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." Matthew 18:20

I've had the same thing happen to me several times in the last few weeks and in the midst of several situations. It's happened to me before, but I never really thought about it much. However, when it happened these last few times in close proximity to each other, I decided God needed me to pay attention and here I am.

So, what was it that happened? Well, I was talking with different folks in different settings - the UCC clergy group who visited here to learn about the Pollinator Garden projects, the Westerly Substance Abuse Prevention group I am now part of, the Westerly Health Impact Collaborative board I serve on at the hospital, the local clergy, etc. - and the same question kept coming up, over and over again. "How many folks are in your church anyway? You guys are always doing so much!" Then, when I give the answers – membership hovering around 150 and worship attendance around 50 - the folks posing the question are startled. "That's all? How is that possible? How do you do everything you do? I thought it had to be a really big church!" That's when I smile and tell

them, "big" is a relative concept when it comes to God.

Our church may not have a lot of members but it does have a really big heart. Really big. But you all know that already. If someone needs something and we find out about it, we respond. Just enough hesitation to plan out the best response but absolutely no hesitation on whether to help. Only on how to help in ways that are really in the best interest of the individuals needing help, not to make ourselves feel good about ourselves for helping. This attitude is second nature here so I am sure you are unaware of just how rare this quality – of loving folks as they need to be loved rather than how we think they should be loved – really is.

Our church also has a big capacity for hope -- for itself, for our community, for the world. This church dares to be what it proclaims itself to be - a beacon of hope for all. This church has fully embraced that UCC branding slogan of a decade ago: "No matter who you are or where you are on your journey of faith, you are welcome here." That is a statement grounded in hope and in a big, big faith that whoever and whatever comes our way, we will be up to the challenge. You have proven this to be the case time and time again. As people die or drift away from church for health reasons or move to new communities, we mourn the loss and then we move forward. The way we do things may change - like doing "Dine To Donate" events as fundraisers instead of our own church suppers but our commitment to hope and faith never waivers.

This is why folks think we must be a "big" church because we are doing "big" things and we're successful at it! For example, our Dine to Donate events have been the most successful Stonington Pizza Palace has ever hosted. Our Pollinator Gardens project is moving forward and people know about it. They've seen the meadow coverings and are watching to see what happens. They've heard about the planned labyrinth and are waiting until it's available to walk. People also know about out prayer ministry and how quick we are to respond to prayer requests of all kinds. Most of all they know we are a church founded in and living out love as best as we are able, with the help of God. So, when you're tempted to lament that our little church is not bigger, just remember all those people who are convinced we are big because of the difference we are making in our community every day. Would we love to have more people each week? Of course! Is that ever going to happen as we hope it will? That, dear ones, is up to God. In the meantime, we are striving always to be the church God needs us to be, and that's all that really matters. Hope to see you on Sunday!




- Pencils of good quality (like Ticonderoga) that sharpen well


