FROM THE PASTOR ...

"Come to me all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest."

Matthew 11:28

These words of Jesus from the Gospel of Matthew really ring true these days when there is so much to be anxious about in our lives each day. The news is filled with overwhelming stories of every sort. Anger, fear and incivility simmer just below the surface of too many situations since we appear to have forgotten how to talk to one another as people instead of opponents in a debate. God's heart must surely be aching, Jesus' tears falling, as our inability to love each other as we love ourselves is everywhere evident. Indeed, we are weary and tired of the anxieties and worries which dog our everyday lives. And yet, our faith reminds us we do have so very much to be thankful for, so many blessings to reclaim and celebrate as our own reminders that God's future is always inviting us forward in hope and in joy.

But how do we get from where we are now – anxious, tired, weary – to that new hope and renewal we know God is offering us? Once again, Jesus gives us the answer. "Come to me all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens and I

will give you rest." Weary – does that describe you some days? I'm betting it does. I know it sure describes me! How about the carrying heavy burdens part. Sound familiar? Sure does to me. And to that Jesus says simply, "I will give you rest." Rest. As if it were that simple.

But, maybe it is. After all, it's summertime a time of more relaxed schedules and extra daylight for those long walks or just sitting on the deck to watch the sunset. Summer! The time of warm days at the beach, hikes in the mountains, kayaking in the river or just curling up in your favorite spot with a great book. Or maybe, you're the type who's in to what I think of as "active" rest. You know painting the bathroom, cleaning the garage, relandscaping the back yard – doing all those things you never have time to do and yet doing them gives you a deep sense of satisfaction renewing your sense of your place in this world. That's still rest. my friend. Whatever allows you to step away from, move back from, take a break from everything in your life that stresses you out qualifies as rest. Think of rest not as the act of doing nothing, although for some of us doing nothing is pretty appealing. Instead, think of rest as doing something you love to do but never give yourself permission to do. This is rest for your soul, the most important kind. Rest for your soul allows healing from all the bruising you absorb as life bumps along with all its challenges, expected and unexpected. Rest for your soul comes when you recognize that your body, your mind and your heart are indeed weary from carrying too much in the way of burdens of all kinds.

That's why, as summer unfolds for you, I urge you to accept Jesus' invitation to rest, to set aside those wearying heavy burdens for a time and just be. Do something nice for yourself, just because. Pause long enough to remember and savor the people and relationships that enrich and bless your life. Rest. Renewal. Sabbath – even God needed the seventh day to rest! So, relax, enjoy and just be for a bit this summer. I know I hope to and I hope you will too. But, we'll still be looking for you on Sundays!!

Bring a brown bag supper and a cold drink to this delightful gathering where we enjoy the ocean and talk about a good book, and anything else that comes up in the moment.



CAPITAL CAMPAIGN REPORT

Now that our three-year capital campaign project is officially over, the Trustees would like to thank the members and friends of the church for a successful campaign that raised over \$85,000. This money has been used to fund the following projects to improve the church facility:

- A new macadam walkway and railing was installed from the circular drive to the lower entrance (\$2,000). Project was funded by anonymous donations designated for the walkway.
- A new flat roof has been installed over the kitchen, office, Bell Courtyard entrance, and Sanctuary (\$34,200).
- The Circular Drive was repaved (\$9,900).
- New Bell Courtyard windows were installed (\$7,400). Project was supplemented with funds from the Laura Dawley Memorial.

- A new Sound System has been installed in the sanctuary. (Estimated final cost to be \$3,500). Project was supplemented with funds from the Darla Rines Memorial.
- Design plans for the Pollinator Garden (\$625).
- Purchase of an exterior event A-frame sign (\$180).
- Purchase of an AED installed in Fellowship Hall (\$900).
- Purchase of a Baby Changing Table installed in the handicapped bathroom (\$224).

The Trustees will be considering ways to use the remaining funds.
