#### FROM THE PASTOR ...

"...on earth as it is in heaven." Matthew 6:10c

I learned a new word today! I know, I know – you'd think these things wouldn't be all that exciting to me by now, but they are. Especially when the new word is a theological concept I had never heard before!

The term I learned is anthropopathic. It refers to a specific type of theology -anthropopathic theology. As is often the case with complex -dare I say obtuse - theological terms, this one is based in a fairly simple idea. It refers to the notion of God's personhood. Anthropopathic theology describes the personhood of God through its typically human expression of face, presence and personality. This means considering God as a person, not just some divine being operating in a completely different reality from our own. This concept appears in an article by Daniel Ross Goodman in the Harvard Divinity Bulletin (Winter/Spring 2014). It is grounded in the idea that, if we are created in God's image as persons, then God must have a "personhood" too.

What's striking about this concept is that we who claim the title theologian are trained to see all those passages in the Bible, especially the Old Testament, where God is presented in more human-like, personal terms as examples of humans making God over in the image of humans instead of the other way around. Referred to as anthropromorphizing God, this notion of making God more human is thus not usually viewed in a positive light. In contrast, this article describes anthropopathic theology as arguing for a God with a real sense of God's own personhood. This makes all those passages where God is longing for a deeper, more committed and loving relationship with the people easier to understand. All those passages where God laments over the faithlessness of the people sound so profoundly personal because they are. God's heart literally is breaking as God's people turn away.

So what does all this have to do with us in our church, in our little corner of the world? And how does it connect with Lent and our focus on the Lord's Praver as we make our way to Easter? To me, it all comes down to that one little phrase from the Prayer which I quoted above – "on earth as it is in heaven." In these few words. Jesus has us ask God to make our lives more like they would be if we lived face to face with God each day. When we pray Jesus' Prayer we are really asking God to transform us so that our lives can be more like God's dream for us. We can pray in this very personal way because we are created in God's image and likeness. When we pray "on earth as it is in heaven" we are claiming our birthright to live now in hope that God's ways are ours more fully than we ever dreamed. This is the promise of Easter – that new life is more than possible. New life is already among us, and always has been. We have only to see it, claim it and live it. That's the message that sent Jesus to the cross. It's the why of the empty tomb on Easter. On earth as it is in heaven. Imagine that . . .
