FROM THE PASTOR

"Now to God who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine..." Ephesians 3:20

I love this text from Ephesians. I pray it every morning and have done so for so long that the paper I have it written out on is vellowed and smudged, the ink barely legible in places. But it hardly matters because this verse is imprinted on my heart. This text has carried me through all the challenges of life that have come to me over the years. Family heartaches, work challenges, economic downturns personally and in the world in which we live - this verse has brought me through them all with its simple message that God is always able to empower us to handle whatever comes our way, to meet whatever challenge needs to be met, and to do so in ways more marvelous than anything we can possibly imagine left to our own devices. God's simple truth for us just waiting for us to claim it and hold on to it with all our might.

Given my long history with this text, I wasn't entirely surprised when it was chosen from among four other possibilities as the grounding text for the "Next Fifty Years of Our Church" Campaign. Paul's words written almost two thousand years ago still speak powerfully to what we have found the courage to do right here and now in our church – claim the future as our own exciting new chapter in the life of our church. We have faced our fears and decided we are more than up to the challenge of pursuing this Capital Campaign. Understandable anxiety notwithstanding, we have decided we are ready, willing and *excited* to begin the work of creating our church's future together. Our "Next Fifty Years of Our Church" Campaign – or simply The Campaign – begins!

For now, know that leadership has been identified and the three working groups of The Campaign have enthusiastically tackled their tasks at our most recent gathering with Consultant Peter Saros this past Monday.
