### FROM THE PASTOR ...

"And they laughed at him." Mark 5:40a

This short little sentence comes almost at the end of one of the most famous of the healing stories of Jesus – the one where he brought a dead little girl back to life. This is a very unusual story because there are actually two healing stories merged into one. Mark along with Matthew and Luke tell this story in the same way - with the healing of the bleeding woman embedded into the story of the healing of a little girl. On his way to heal the little girl, Jesus is delayed by a woman who crept up from behind and touched the hem of his robe to be healed. As she is explaining herself to Jesus, the man learns his daughter had died. Jesus tells him not to fear but only believe and they go to the girl. When they arrive, Jesus confronts the professional mourners already gathered outside weeping and wailing asking them why they are making such a commotion when the child is only sleeping. They laughed at him. Unfazed, Jesus goes into the house where he takes her by the hand and says, "Little girl, get up." And she does.

"And they laughed at him." As I read through this familiar story once more, this one short

sentence leaped out at me. We just don't think about people laughing at Jesus. Now, I love to imagine Jesus laughing with people and I am sure he did since we know table fellowship was central to his ministry. He was always inviting himself to dinner somewhere. But the people in this story were most definitely not laughing with Jesus. They were laughing at him for daring to think he could make a difference in a hopeless situation. They laughed at him for daring to believe that faith and complete trust in God could change the reality in front of him. People laughed at him then and people are still laughing at Jesus today. And the truth is they are laughing at us too as people who follow Jesus. Most of us don't think too much about the people who just cannot understand why church and God and Jesus are so important in our lives. These people, family or friends or strangers, might not ever laugh in our faces but when we leave them to go to church, they are shaking their heads in wonder and confusion. Oh well, we think. To each his own. Only problem is that these are the very people Jesus expects us to reach out to with the Good News of our faith. How we do this is our task as the people of God, as the church.

This past Sunday we voted to approve a Capital Campaign for our church, an exciting and gutsy move designed to help us reclaim our beautiful, unique building as our primary tool for sharing the Good News of Jesus. But repairing and updating the building and equipment is not the only focus of the Capital Campaign. Church growth strategies to expand our efforts in reaching out to those very people wondering about God all around us will also be a vital part of the task ahead. And we can do this! The success we enjoyed this past weekend with Almost Iron Chef showed us that. The people calling for Valentine Tea reservations before the signs are even up show us that. The people asking for prayers from us all the time tell us the real truth - people are not laughing at us. They're wishing they had what we have as members and friends of this amazing church. They're wondering what it means to know and love Jesus and why it matters so much. Who better to tell them than us?

So as February rolls along ushering in the beginning of Lent and our Capital Campaign in the process, we have much to be excited about as we think about the year ahead. We will be able to raise the funds to do what we need to do with this incredible building. We are ready to grow our church in people, in financial viability and in faith. All we need do is remember what Jesus said to the little girl's father before they got to his house – "Do not fear, only believe." We can do that. We will do that, together. May God guide our footsteps along the path being revealed in front of us and may the laughter we hear be our own, as we follow Jesus with joy into God's amazing future.

## A Note from the Financial Secretary and Assistant Financial Secretary:

Thank you to all who faithfully contribute to our church and its missions!

We wanted to share an idea that may make it easier when writing checks out for various donations. Sometimes, we need to "catch up" with missed weeks of offering, or make special donations (such as for Advent, Neighbors in Need, Per Capita Dues, Fair Trade, etc.). Even for these diverse donations, you can simply write one check and attach it to all applicable pledge envelopes (donation designations), perhaps placing them all in a business envelope. Alternatively, you could include an itemized written list of donations with the one check in one pledge envelope, or simply list each week/special offering on the check memo. This last option does not leave much room, but will do in a pinch. We know that checks cost money and want to make you aware that we do not need to have separate checks for each donation. Just double-check your addition, and put the whole amount on one check. Please be sure to use one of the methods above to let the financial secretaries know how the money should be credited.

If you would like clarification about these suggestions, or need a 2015 Pledge Form (it's never too late!), feel free to ask Janet Allen, Financial Secretary, or Jenny Brummund, Assistant.
