FROM THE PASTOR ...

"Is anything too wonderful for the Lord?"

Genesis 18:14a

Not surprisingly perhaps, these words are spoken by an angel. We would expect an angel to know in a way we never could just how wonderful the Lord is. After all, we think of angels as knowing God "up close and personal." The angel said this to Abraham as the angel was scolding Sarah, Abraham's wife, for laughing when the angel told them she would bear a child – her first child – in her old age. Sarah laughs and we can imagine how Abraham must have looked as he heard the angel's fantastic prediction.

"Is anything too wonderful for the Lord?"
These are good words for us to ponder as life slows down in these summertime months. We have a tendency these days to look for the bad news, to expect the worst, to focus on the gray clouds and miss the silver lining completely. And why wouldn't we. The news is rarely anything but depressing. Even the local countryside looks desolate as the gypsy moth caterpillars eat their fill at the expense of our trees. Summertime traffic we know all too well will only get worse as tourists and day-trippers to the beaches pour into the area. "Is anything too

wonderful for the Lord?" Sometimes it's difficult to remember what wonderful looks like, feels like, sounds like. Then something totally unexpected happens...

I have had two such wonderful experiences here at our church in the last two weeks. Well, truthfully more than two but two in particular I want to share with you. The first one happened about two weeks ago. I was working at my desk in my office when I looked out my window and saw all these little birds running around. I had no idea what they were but they looked sort of like tiny pheasants. I tried to get a better look and that's when I saw the momma turkey and realized these were her babies! I counted 12!!! Momma was letting them explore, I think for perhaps the first time, outside their nest most likely located in our woodlands behind the church. They were all excitedly running around, most of them in one big clump. But there was one little one determined to go off on his own, checking out what was happening underneath some of the shrubbery. I had cautiously stepped outside to try to get a photo, but momma freaked! She clucked and squawked and the little clump quickly ran toward her but the one hold-out scurried deeper under the azalea bush. Momma stayed right where she was staring me down as she tried to encourage Mr. Independent out from under the bush (there's always a kid like that, right?). So, I backed off and returned to my office, still thrilled by this most remarkable encounter with some of God's wild creatures.

My second wonderful experience happened when I stayed late for a meeting one evening last week. I was heading to my car parked on the circle by the Bell Courtyard when I saw them at the far side of the driveway – a momma deer and two little fawns! They were adorable! My "city girl" reality is now showing because that is the *first time in my life* I had ever seen deer that close who weren't in a zoo. Of course, momma deer had spotted me as soon as the door opened and was watching me warily long before I saw her. So, just as I noticed them, momma nudged them off back into the woods. Once again, one fawn followed her right away but the other lingered, looking at me before he too took off.

Is anything too wonderful for the Lord? NO! My two encounters with these baby creatures and their mommas reminded me of that. All these baby

critters also reminded me that our efforts to reach out to families with children and youth are starting to bear fruit. And much more is in the works for this fall in this regard. The YES program will return with a unique Bible geography and missions curriculum as its centerpiece but retaining the nature, service and art components. We will have a Youth Group this fall for the first time in years! We will be offering an exciting new "dinner ministry" called Harvest Table which you will hear more about as summer comes to an end. We will also be continuing our work on the Pollinator Garden and Labyrinth Project which is already attracting a lot of interest from the community! Dear friends, we are proof that the wonderfulness of God is always being revealed in our midst if only we will make the effort to notice and respond. That's just what I hope you'll do this summer... But we'll still be looking for you on Sunday!
