FROM THE PASTOR ...

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:21

Jesus is telling us a simple truth in these few words spoken on an ancient hillside. He is saying that your life makes plain what is important to you, regardless of what you say is important. He is reminding us that how we invest our time, our talent, our resources and ourselves is what makes up our lives each day. It becomes the foundation on which the rest of our lives are built.

Evaluating the foundation of our lives — what we build our lives on each day — is the work of the Season of Lent in the church year. Lent is the time when we make a special effort to consider who we really are in relation to God and each other and how this reality measures up with who we would like to be and who God thinks we can be. Lent is the time to figure out where our hearts really are, and whether we

are chasing after the right treasure in the daily grind of life.

This is soul work. It takes intentional focus and effort and a special sort of courage to face who we are to ourselves, to the other people in our lives, and to God. We do that at our church in a number of ways throughout Lent. We begin on Ash Wednesday, March 5, with a special service that includes the distribution of ashes, a very moving but simple ritual designed to remind us of our fragile humanity. Our Lenten journey continues through worship each Sunday, this year focusing on the central prayer of the Christian faith, "the Lord's Prayer" which Jesus himself taught to his disciples. We will be exploring this beautiful prayer as the foundation of our faith and its role as just what Jesus always intended it to be – the gateway to a deeper relationship with God. Additional Lenten observances include an "At Home" Lenten Devotional Guide with suggestions for daily bible readings and prayer. A weekly opportunity for intentional prayer and reflection with others will be available with the Sweet Hour of Prayer Group moved to 6 pm on Thursdays during Lent.

Spring is coming, praise God, so as you watch the snow continue to melt and the first green shoots push up through the newly thawed ground, I hope you will see in them an invitation to do a little growing yourself this Lenten season. Invest a little of your time and energy in understanding yourself a little better. How does your life reveal what is truly important to you? If it doesn't, why doesn't it? How might God be part of any changes you'd like to make? In other words, where *is* your heart – really – and where would you like it to be? Only you can answer that.
