#### FROM THE PASTOR ....

" '...in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.' " Genesis 12:3b

This phrase is part of the very beginning of the story of two of the most important personages of the Old Testament we know as Abraham and Sarah. As the story of their relationship with God begins, they are known by other names, Abram and Sarai. I chose their story as one of the foundational stories for the YES program this year because it is one in which the response to God's call to new life and new beginnings is most readily visible. At the time God tells them they are going to start over and begin a new life, Abram and Sarai are in their 70's! And yet, they respond as God asks them to, leaving everything and everyone they know in order to undertake the journey to the new land God has promised them. God also makes them another promise, stated in the text above – "... in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." Now that's a promise! And, an incredible legacy to all of us still today who seek to discern and follow God's plan for our lives.

Being a blessing to all families is, I think, the essential purpose of the church – any church, but especially our church at this moment in its life. We have already been a blessing in so many lives in so many ways. That is evident everywhere you look in

the church almost any time you visit. You will hear new life in the conversations bouncing around Fellowship Hall every Sunday. You will see new life in the children, youth and adults participating so enthusiastically in the YES program each week. You will hear new life in our music program as music minister, Dav Cranmer, guides our choir in the celebration of their own unique gifts and talents. You will experience new life in all the many activities visible on our church calendar at any time. Truly, ours is a church which "gets" what it is to be "church" – a gathered community of God's Beloved people seeking to support one another for life and ministry in our own lives each day. Worship on Sunday in our extraordinary building is where we come each week to be renewed and re-energized for this work God has laid on our hearts. Whether it's donating socks and underwear for the homeless, or cash for the Deacons Fund or baking bread for Communion or cookies for fellowship time or a collation or one of our Teas, this is a church which understands what it means to give generously from our hearts of our time, talent and treasure.

Your loving and generous hearts are what visitors sense when they come into the building! The warmth and kindness in our church are so real you can feel them when you walk in the door and that is simply extraordinary. That's what gives me such hope for our future. Malala is the girl who stood up for education in Afghanistan only to be shot by the Taliban. She miraculously survived and continued her advocacy for education for which she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2014, its youngest recipient ever.

Also on the table for consideration by BOOKS is the classic To Kill A Mockingbird. Noteworthy in regard to this book is that it is also one folks across the RI Conference UCC are being urged to read as preparation to attend the play based on the book during its run at Trinity Rep in Providence in March.
