FROM THE PASTOR ...

"Hear O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when your rise."

Deuteronomy 6:4-7

These words, known as the Shema in Judaism, are the cornerstone of faith for Jews and Christians the world over. Jesus' version of the Great Commandment appears in both Matthew and Mark: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. The second is like it. You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37-39) These texts one from the Old Testament and the other from the New – form the foundation on which all of the stories, all of the teachings, all of the wisdom of our faith tradition are built. If we don't know these two texts, if we don't understand them and do our best to incorporate them into life as we live it each day, then our faith will forever be incomplete.

I wanted us to begin our new program year this fall by pausing to consider and reflect on the Shema and the Great Commandment precisely because they embody the goals of how God expects us, needs us, to live our lives as people of faith each day. In order to understand these powerful words, and what they truly mean, we need to go back to the beginning, back to the basics of our faith and how it is the Bible informs that faith. our worship and our mission as God's people. This is why the Deacons and I have decided to spend this fall focusing on some key stories of the Old Testament in worship and beyond. As Christians, we know many of the stories of Jesus and even a few about Paul and the other apostles but how many of the Old Testament stories do we know? Sure, we may know the names of Adam and Eve, Noah and Abraham but why should we? Or Jacob, or Joseph or Moses or Samuel or David? We know the names but do we know their stories? Do we have any clue why they are integral pieces to faith we profess each day as followers of Jesus? We're proposing to re-discover this together this fall as a congregation and family of faith in this place.

Lots of other exciting stuff going on here at the church this fall as usual! We're revamping worship just a tad to make room for more voices and more stories so please check that out here in the *Beacon* and decide how you might like to participate. A new weekly Wednesday evening service called "Sanctuary" begins on September 5 at 6 pm offering a much requested midweek worship option. Sabbath Circles, our at home version of Sunday School, returns this year in a slightly new format as a weekly insert to the order of worship.

Fall comes round once more and exciting things are happening here at UCC Westerly. We hope you'll be a part of them as you are interested and able. Do know we miss you when you aren't here and we hold you in prayer always. We'll be looking for you!



Make a note!! You really need a Bible of your own to get the most out of Sabbath Circles and Sunday worship!



## Here's the latest buzz on the Pollinator Garden Project!

- Appearances are deceiving as our Meadow in the making proves!! The Meadow did not grow in as we hoped nor did it fail completely. The weather was so hot and dry and the church's water access for the meadow was not as anticipated due to technical difficulties with the plumbing which we are in the process of correcting with the assistance of the Trustees. But, in the meantime, the Meadow grew in robustly with more weeds than anticipated but still some good pollinator plants. After much discussion and conversation with our experts, we decided to mow it and keep it mowed, letting it winter over to see what comes up next spring. Then, we'll "edit" and move forward!!
- Our Rain Garden and Rain Barrel continue doing what they are supposed to do. In the garden, extreme heat killed off some of the tinier seedlings which will be replaced but the garden is working well as we learned during the heavy storms in August. Exciting to see!
- We are in the final planning phases on the installation of the Labyrinth which we hope to break ground for some time in September. Many hands will be needed for the day we lay the paths or "circuits" of the labyrinth. Watch for details!
- In conjunction with the Pollinator Gardens Project, the Trustees have put together a plan for care of the other parts of the property which are not part of the Project. Check out the sign-up sheet outside Fellowship Hall to "adopt" a part of the property for a little "TLC" when you have time.

- ☐ Instead of a numbered pledge offering envelope for the regular weekly offering if you forget your envelope one Sunday. Do check 'Regular Offering' on the front of the envelope, and include your name if enclosing cash.
- © For the monthly Deacons Fund offering received on every Communion Sunday. For this offering the envelope should NOT be placed in the offering plates passed by the ushers but instead placed in the Deacons Fund Baskets passed during the last hymn.
- © For any guest who wishes to contribute to the regular weekly offering discreetly. Please check 'Regular Offering', especially if it is Communion Sunday. If also making a Communion offering, please use a separate Pew Envelope.
