FROM THE PASTOR

"Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up the other..." Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

An interior church work day is coming up in February along with other opportunities to be involved in the life and ministries of this church are described in this newsletter.

So, dear friends, life in our church is good. It's true that finances are a little tight due to a combination of a downward turn in our investment portfolio along with decreased pledging as members move away, pass away or just find life circumstances so changed that their giving to the church needs to decrease. 




Everyone welcome to our first official committee planning meeting after worship on **Sunday**,


Come for all or part of the morning to help lemon oil the pews in the Sanctuary and the woodwork in the bell courtyard narthex.
