### Trustee Notes

Carol Lindsay is our new secretary/office Administrator. She started on March 18<sup>th</sup> and is working with Susan through the end of the month. Feel free to stop by to say hello, introduce yourself, and welcome her into our church family.

We want to thank everyone for keeping up with pledged donations. Our total income through February was \$19,491 which is almost \$600 (.5%) more than our anticipated income. The real good news is that pledge donations through February were \$14,878 which is almost \$3,700 (5%) more than expected. Our total expenses through February were \$22,261 bringing our deficit to \$2,330. Our utility costs continue to be higher than expected due to rate increases and the cold weather in February. Our January electric bill of \$303 was covered by several generous donations. Our February electric bill was \$334 and gas was \$1,171.

The Trustees are looking to reduce our electric bill and you can help. One of our energy saving initiatives is to replace all the light compact fluorescent, flood, and standard light bulbs throughout the building with LED bulbs. We have already replaced the flood lights and some of the recess lights in the sanctuary as well as two hallways with LED bulbs. We still have approximately 150 more to replace. You can help by donating LED light bulbs. We need the following types:

- 62 40W A19 general purpose bulb (Sanctuary)
- 30 60W A19 general purpose bulb (needed throughout)
- 30 40W G25 small globe bulb (Hallways)
- 26 65W BR30 indoor flood bulbs (Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary)

Yes there are that many lights in the church, not counting the 4-foot fluorescent ceiling fixtures in the classrooms and kitchen. Look for LED bulbs that have a color rating of 'Soft White" or "Warm White". These give off light similar to a regular incandescent bulb as opposed to the white light from "Bright White" or "Day Light" LED bulbs.

We are working with the Trustees as we did last year on the SPRING CLEAN-UP of the church grounds as a part of our annual Earth Day Celebrations:

**OUR BIG NEWS** will become quickly visible as April begins when our landscape architect, Jim from Stonington Gardens and his crew begin work on the installation of the next phase of the pollinator gardens on the Upper Lawn!! Here's what's planned:

- Installation of a bog garden to be called *Becky's Frog Bog* as a memorial to our dear Becky Morrone.
- Installation of planting beds around the bog garden
- Installation of a sumac planting bed

Installation of a bluestone stepping stone path connecting the labyrinth to the parking lot.

Additional plans for the Gardens this year include replanting the Rain Garden in the areas which were consumed by our local bunny population, establishing bird habitats in several areas throughout the property and, hopefully, the installation of a Peace Pole garden in the glen on the far side of the lower driveway by this fall.
