LENT AT UCC WESTERLY 2019

Lent is the time in the church year where we pause to reflect more deeply on our relationship with Jesus and God and the Holy Spirit. There are many ways to do this and a flyer with detailed suggestions for your Lenten observance this year will be available at church this Sunday, and posted on the church website as well.

Our focus during worship this year will be on forgiveness. Central to the practice of Christianity, it is often misunderstood. It's one of those things which seems simple on the surface but is really much more nuanced when we pause to consider it more intentionally. In both Sunday morning worship and the midweek Sanctuary services for the first five weeks of Lent, we will be considering what it means to say *"Forgiveness Is ... Necessary ... Personal ... Complicated ... On-going ... Humbling."*

Our Holy Week services will kick off once again with the Palm Sunday Symbols Service on April 14, and continue with the Maundy Thursday Service of Tenebrae on Thursday, April 18. We will offer two different Easter Sunday worship opportunities once again this year: Easter Sunrise at Misquamicut Beach @ 6am and our own festive Easter Celebration at our usual 9:30am worship time.

May God be with us as always but especially in the weeks ahead as we pause and take time to reawaken and renew our faith and its place in our lives.





Trustee Notes

Our Income in January was \$10,539 which is \$1,044 more than our anticipated income. Our expenses for January were \$12,487 which is \$767 more than our anticipated income. Our deficit for January was \$1,948. This was mainly due to quarterly payment for insurance.

Our utility costs are slightly higher than expected. Electricity was \$303 (usage is down but rates have increased) and gas was \$953. The Trustees would appreciate and thank anyone willing to make a special offering to help defray these costs. The donation should be made with a note that it is to be used for utility costs.

A job offer will be made shortly to replace Susan, who is retiring in March.
