

THE SABBATH CIRCLES HOME SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Unit Theme: Understanding Forgiveness

Today's Scripture: Luke 24:1-12

Key Verse: "The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground but the men said to them, 'why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen."

Questions to go deeper:

- Read through the story carefully several times. Then take out a piece of paper and write down the details. What questions do you have after doing this?
- Who were the women who were present and spoke to the "two men in dazzling white?"
- Why do you think the disciples dismissed the women's news as "an idle tale?"
- Why do you think Peter went to the tomb despite what the others thought? What do you think he did next?

Activity possibilities:

- Color the coloring page for Holy week on reverse side.
- Find a piece of white drawing paper and a wide variety of art supplies including markers, colored pencils, paints, glitter and anything else you would like to use in this project. Read all the instructions before making this decision! First, sit down and imagine the tomb with Jesus' body in it. Then, try to imagine the exact moment when the power of God entered Jesus' body allowing him to rise into new life once again. What does it look like? Sound like? Feel like? Then, using the art supplies you have gathered, re-create that moment of resurrection in your own unique artistic creation. Once it is finished, add the caption: "He is not here, but has risen" somewhere to
