Unit Theme: Family Ties in the church

Today's Scripture: Job 12:7-10

Key Verse: "In God's hand is the life of every living thing and the breath of every human being." Job 12:10

Questions to go deeper:

- The Book of Job is not the first place one would think to look for wisdom about caring for Creation as we are remembering on Earth Day. If your bible has an explanation at the beginning of each book, see what it has to say about Job to see why this is. - Job is the one saying these words as proof of the goodness of God. What do you think the animals or the birds or the plants have to teach us? Why is it so difficult for us to learn?
- What do you think Job means when he says, "does not the ear test words?"
