FROM THE PASTOR ... "You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored?" Matthew 5:13a

This is a lovely and simple text all too easy to hurry through and that's too bad because it's message of the importance of self-care is an important one. Let me explain. Imagine you have spent a delightful day at the beach. Perfect weather, perfect spot on the sand, water is just right for jumping in and cooling off and no dangerous undertow to worry about, the seagulls leave your picnic basket alone – a perfect day. Now, remember what it tastes like if you lick your lips after a day at the beach. Salty, right? So, you can and actually have been salty! And what does that salty taste remind you of? The wonderful day you have just enjoyed. So, too, when you know what it is to feel alive in a whole different way because you have Jesus in your life, you become "salty" flavored in a sense with the love of Jesus, with the knowledge of how precious you are to God. Salty can also refer to "sweat salty" like when you've been working outside on a hot day, weeding in the pollinator gardens at church, or helping to make the baskets for the bazaar or even baking cookies to

bring to share at Fellowship on Sunday. Salty – a sign that you are and have been and will be ready to work for Jesus to bring the light of God into the world. Important stuff, to be sure. And, what our church works hard at all year.

Now we come to the second part of that verse - "if the salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored?" That is THE question, isn't it, especially as summer days invite us to set aside the long "to-do" lists in favor of a day at the beach, or a cool glass of lemonade and a good book on the deck. I don't know about you but come this time of year in the busy life of this church, I definitely feel less salty than I know I need to be as I engage in this work of ministry as Jesus hopes I will. I know at least some of you feel the same way. So, how can our saltiness be restored? That at least is simple to answer. Just invest in the three "R's" – Rest, Relaxation and Renewal. In other words – take a breath, take a break and let go of all it is that makes you crazy and frantic. Not easy to do, but oh so important! Summertime in the church is a lovely time when we quite intentionally slow down our work and just enjoy being a community of faith together. And that, dear friends, is a very good thing.

So, as summer settles in here at our church, I hope you will relax and enjoy some down time, resting in the presence of God wherever you find yourselves, and I hope some of it will be at church on Sunday mornings! In July when I am on vacation – re-salting myself as it were – you will have wonderful opportunities to hear a guest preacher and two lay speakers plus the ever popular hymn sing Sunday. Enjoy! Then, in August when I return, we'll take a little time reconnecting with the Gospel Lectionary texts as the focal point of worship for a few weeks.

Thus my wish for you this summer is ample time to invest in restoring your own saltiness. I do hope at least some of that will involve you coming to church on Sunday mornings to reconnect with your church family and just be in this special place. We'll be looking for you...





### **Trustee Notes**

We want to thank everyone for keeping up with pledged donations. Our total income through May was \$45,208 which is about \$2,265 less than our anticipated income. The real good news is that pledge donations through May were \$33,257 which is almost \$5,218 (7%) more than expected. We want to thank everyone for keeping up with pledges and ask that you continue to do so over the summer months.

Our total expenses through May were \$47,473 bringing our deficit to \$6,840. This high deficit is mainly due to quarterly insurance payment of \$1,983. Our utility costs continue to be higher than expected due to rate increases and the colder weather in this spring. Our May electric bill was \$235 and gas was \$491.

The Trustees will be seeking quotes this Fall for repaving a section of the upper parking lot. Funds from the Capital Campaign will be used to cover the cost.

The Trustees are also looking for volunteers to help with maintenance of the grounds. The pollinator garden group has been doing an excellent job of beautifying the grounds with flowers. But the following areas can use some work:

- Removal of grass in parking lot cracks
- Weed area around granite sign along Pequot Trail
- Removal of weed is area between lower walkway and retaining wall
- Remove weeds around shed in lower parking lot
- Remove/cut weeds along stone wall and our neighbor's property

The next Trustee meeting will be August 27th at 6 PM.

Thanks to everyone who gave to our Babies and Ladies Collection for the PNC. These items are so desperately needed on a daily basis.

### **July and August PNC Collection**



During the summer months we will be collecting First Aid Items, Toilet Tissue, and Dry Pet Food. A strange combination, for sure, but these are some of the most needed items at the PNC. First Aid items should be limited to band-aids, bandages, gauze, and adhesive tape; in other words, no medicinal products, please. A reminder that toilet tissue should be donated in no more than four or six-roll packs. Also, dry pet food is a much healthier option than moist foods.

We will no longer be holding onto PNC items until the end of the donation period, as there is always an immediate need for the requested items. We are hoping to deliver the donations soon after they are brought to the church.
