Unit Theme: What is God asking of us in this moment?

Lesson connected to Sunday, September 29, 2019

Today's Scripture: Proverbs 2:1-15

Key Verse: "If you seek it like silver, and search for it as for hidden treasures – then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God." Proverbs 2:4-5

Contexts of the Scripture:

- Look up Proverbs in the Table of Contents of your bible. Where is it found?
- Check out this link to Wikipedia to learn more about Proverbs: <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Book_of_Proverbs</u>
- Proverbs is part of what is called "wisdom literature" in the bible, along with Psalms, Ecclesiastes and the Song of Solomon. What wise words can you find in today's text?
- Custom and tradition hold that King Solomon wrote Proverbs but this is highly unlikely. Rather, it is most likely a compilation of the works of many writers working over a span of time. Do you think it matters whether or not King Solomon wrote Proverbs? Why or why not?

Questions to go deeper:

- Read through the text carefully and make a list of what the writer says one must do in order to "understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God."
- What does the text say happens to you if your quest for understanding and knowledge of God is successful? What is the benefit of this to the one who seeks?
- Verses 12-15 specifically talk about this knowledge and understanding of God as being critical in being able to recognize and respond to evil when it is encountered. How might this be an important skill to have? Have you experienced a time when you didn't realize someone was being devious with you and you didn't know it at the time? How did you feel when you found out? How might things have been different if you had recognized their true intent earlier? What guidance for such a situation do you find in this Proverbs text?


Activity possibilities:

- Family activities:
 - Add "Proverbs" to your bible timeline. See the Wikipedia article to see where it might go.
 - At a family gathering, like a meal, have a conversation about a time when each of you wished you had better understood what was really going on in a specific situation – like when one of you were hurt by someone or confused by someone who was acting in a way you didn't understand. Look at the text together and decide which verse best describes what would have been helpful to you in the situation you are talking about.

- From watching the trailer, who might be the ones actually following "the way of evil?" Is treating someone badly just because they look and act differently from you a good thing? Why or why not?
