Many thanks for your continued support of the monthly Deacons Fund. Yes, your donations have reached us by mail or passed on by Rev. Ruth. We greatly appreciate this. Also, the Barbara Murano Scholarship Dine-to-Donate will take place this fall, at a date yet to be determined, at Stonington Pizza Palace. Our students will receive their scholarships in advance of the event this year. The funds will go toward replacing the funds used.



Bazaar Updates:

We are planning on our Christmas bazaar taking place in December; however, it may look a bit different. Here are some of the changes being discussed: Rooms to put on hold this year: -Hospitality Room -Children's Shopping (small gift ideas may go in Nostalgia Boutique) -Jewelry Room -No live music in narthex entry. -Not sure if Santa will be making an appearance.

Proposed changes:

-Nostalgia Boutique to use all 4 upper level rooms (If Martha would like to do her cards, this would be the place).

-Artificial trees & decorations will be available to take home to decorate. Folks are encouraged to buy a fresh wreath to decorate at home. Bows can be provided. -Possible greens arrangements can be done at home as well. Decorations/bows/containers can be provided. Greens can still be dropped off outside upper Fellowship Hall door.

-Weather permitting, greens, wreaths, & trees may be sold outside, with rotating sellers.

-Mission/SERRV orders may be placed on line & shipped to home.

-Baskets in Fellowship Hall, with possibility of on-line virtual sale ahead of time.

-Bake room – Also in Fellowship Hall, with the possibility of ordering some items ahead of time. All items to be pre-packaged.

-Silent Auction – Suggestion of folks purchasing & donating gift cards to be auctioned. Possibility of online virtual Silent Auction. Perhaps a mix of gift cards & other Silent Auction items for auction.

Tea: Possibility of advance reservation take-out of sweet breads, cinnamon butter, cookies, dry spiced tea mix.

Other:

- Have runners if folks who order in advance prefer not to enter building. Will need a phone system for contact. -Room monitors for direction & numbers.

-Possibility of spread out hours: Thurs. & Fri. evenings, Saturday, Sunday after worship.

- Possibility of reservations by time slot for number accountability.

Bazaar updates from meeting 8/2/20

Our bazaar hours this year will be spread out over 4 days:

If you have been purging while at home, please plan on bringing your items to church <u>that morning</u>. We will once again be doing our fill-a-bag for 5 dollars system. This avoids have to price & organize all the items, and we did very well last year. Paper grocery bags will be needed.



From the Financial Secretary

Once again, I'd like to thank Ed Stratton and Bill Street for counting and depositing the mailed-in pledges!

A clarification of the statements mailed out in July: Although the date span of the statement says it extends to July 11, in actuality, it may not include any mailed-in pledges sent in the first couple of weeks of July and even very late June. The reasons are twofold: a time gap for mailing time, and a gap between when the July 5th deposit was made (for late June) and when I entered the information in the Church WIndows computer program on July 11th. UCCW Pandemic Response Team update

We are continuing with our plan of opening on September 13 (Sunday after Labor Day) with full social distancing and mask requirements in place including a reservation system for attending morning worship. Facebook live worship will continue. Meetings will be active throughout August and early September as we ready the church.



Do you remember what it means that we are a UCC "5 for 5" church?

It means that our congregation is one which supports all five of the offerings received by the church and then passed on to the denomination in whole or in part. One of these offerings is what known as OCWM monies, which are a part of our regular pledges and gifts to UCC Westerly. These are passed on from our church to the denomination through our local conference, the Southern New England Conference of the United Church of Christ. The amount sent is determined by a formula worked out by our Trustees as a part of the budget preparations each year.

In addition to these funds, there are four additional "special offerings" we receive during worship at various times throughout the year. Obviously, since we have not been worshipping in person, we have not been collecting those offerings. BUT, the ministries those offerings support continue on and their funding has been greatly impacted by this shift in giving by all churches during the Coronavirus shutdown. Those special offerings include:

ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING STRENGTHEN THE CHURCH NEIGHBORS IN NEED THE CHRISTMAS FUND (formerly known as The Veterans of the Cross Fund)

We are reminding you of these special offerings so that if they are something you would normally support with a check or cash donation in the offering plate, you can still support them by mailing a check made payable to our church with a notation in the memo line as to which of the funds you would like to support with your gift. Do know if you name more than one, the funds will be equally split between however many of the offerings you indicate on the memo line. For example, if you send in a check for \$20 with a notation it is to go to "All" it will be split four ways giving each of the special offering funds \$5.

Thank you in advance for any support you are able to offer these ministries at this time knowing that what you do, does make a real difference in the lives of real people.


