#### GOOD NEWS from United Congregational Church of Westerly, UCC in Pawcatuck, CT

#### "Yes, Jesus loves me, this I know!"

The above quote is not a scripture verse, although clearly it captures the sentiment of hundreds if not thousands of verses in the Gospels and epistles of the New Testament. It is from the first verse of the beloved children's hymn, "Jesus Loves Me." I would argue that this, along with perhaps "Amazing Grace" is one of the best known hymns, familiar to folks who have never set foot in a church. When we sing it at our church – at transition points within the service – it always makes me smile when I look around the congregation at all the smiling faces. This is one of those hymns that just makes you smile. Even the most singing resistant folks have been known to mouth the familiar words, "Yes, Jesus loves me."

This is, I think, because it is a wonderfully simple affirmation of our faith as followers of Jesus – Jesus loves us – you and me – no matter what. "Jesus loves me, this I know" is the faith we proclaim distilled down to its most basic form. The verses go on to explain how this happens and why it matters. Verse 2 describes Jesus "taking children on his knee" and verse 3 explains how this unconditional love of Jesus transforms who we are: "Jesus loves me still today, walking with me on my way, wanting as a friend to give light and love to all who live."

This, dear ones, is who we are as we live out our faith together in this wonderful church we claim as our own. We at last returned to inperson worship a few weeks ago and, while many things are different, the important things remain the same. We must wear masks and sit distant from each other, but at last we are together, offering companionship to one another through these difficult days of 2020. We have to have our name on a reservations list and to have signed a receipt for the church's Guidelines for returning to worship under the Coronavirus restrictions in place by CT, but we can relax when we are here, confident that everything is being done to keep us safe. The prayer books and hymn books and bibles are packed away, but our prayer requests are still brought before God as we once again gather in prayer. We cannot sing together but we can celebrate the glorious music of the church as we listen to our magnificent organ while we savor the printed words of beloved hymns. We can hear the greeting of the Deacon and myself. We can receive the Word of God for us in the moment as the Scripture is read. We can pause to reflect and meditate on that word, and the words of the focus hymn, as I share insights and pose questions.

Yes, we have returned to worship in our magnificent church and it is very different, but in every way that matters it is unchanged. In this way, it is like us – we too are not the same people we were when all this began back in March. The trauma of lives interrupted, of everything we loved about living life each day being suddenly ripped away was terrifying. It was unnerving. But, we found our way back on the path that leads to the new reality still emerging as Coronavirus continues to stalk us. No matter because we are still the church. We are still followers of the Risen Christ. We are still and always supporting one another in the challenge of living each day as a person of faith. This is why even though our voices must be silent in worship, we sing from our hearts with confidence, "Jesus loves me, this I know."

This is why our church is alive and thriving in the middle of a global pandemic! Check out all the articles in this edition of the *Beacon* and you will see what I mean. We are an amazing church, filled with incredible people. Thanks be to God!

# From the Financial Secretary

Hello everyone!

Third quarter financial statements (reflecting July, August, and September donations) will be mailed out sometime in October.

As you may know, you are now able to set up donation schedules and one-time donations on the church's website. A record of each donation is sent directly to our pledge accounting system, called Church Windows, and will be shown in your financial statement, just as checks and cash are shown.

I am wondering if anyone in the congregation would be interested in learning how to use the above computer program, to be a second person with this ability and familiarity. This person may be interested in serving the church by way of financial record-keeping on this limited basis, and/or opting to train to do more in the future by learning how collections are counted and deposited. During the COVID 19 times, I have only been recording donations about every two weeks, for about one and a half to two hours each time. Any interested person could work with me, wearing a mask and sitting six feet apart. I only work in the office when no one else is in the office.

Experience on a computer would be a helpful "job" qualification; however, the rest is Easy! Thank you for considering this opportunity! I do plan to continue in my role as Financial Secretary, but I think it is important to train someone else to use the Church Windows program.

Ed Stratton and William Street are your dependable and accurate Assistant Financial Secretaries. They have been faithfully counting the offerings, both mailed-in and now the Sunday service collections. They record monetary "destinations," make up a deposit, and take it to the bank. They have been performing the "bulk" of the financial work since March and I am so grateful for their extra help and flexibility! Thank you Bill and Ed!!

## **Trustee Notes**

#### **Trustee Notes**

We have returned to Sunday morning worship in the sanctuary. The Pandemic Response Team has set guidelines for the worship service to maintain social distancing. During the week the church facility is open for administrative purposes only. This means that only employees and others conducting church business (financial and maintenance) are allowed in the building. No visitors are allowed in the building. The support groups sponsored by the church are now allowed to hold weekly meetings in Fellowship Hall.

Please remember to sign in and out on the forms at each entrance and to use the hand sanitizer and sanitizing wipes.

Recent accomplishments are:

- Hands free soap and towel dispensers have been installed in each of the bathrooms.
- Touchless hand sanitizers have been placed at the Bell Courtyard and Upper Parking Lot entrances.
- The hand-rail at the Bell Courtyard has been replaced.
- Approved installation of a remote internet access point in the sanctuary to stream Sunday morning worship service. Funded by the Diaconate Board.
- Approved purchase of a new computer for the office. Cost will be covered by a

generous donation from Dwayne Spurley and Kevin Dows.

• Approved contracting with Vanco to set up on-line giving to the church

We want to thank all who have been able to give generously to financially support the church. We understand that some may be unemployed (hopefully only temporarily) or have had a reduction in their income. As of the end of August we have received \$43,588 in pledges, \$3,383 less than the anticipated amount of \$46,971. The total income was \$64,200. Thanks to the Paycheck Protection Program loan to cover employee salaries during the Covid-19 Pandemic, our total expenses was only \$70,876, \$3,261 less than the planned amount of \$74,137.

#### **November and December**

For years we have provided a monthly meal to the clients of the WARM Center. Although we started this mission by cooking a meal every second Sunday of the month, we began a much more reasonable approach a few years ago of sending a check for \$1200 to WARM to cover the cost of 12 meals a year. We have enlisted the aid of Stonington Pizza Palace the past few years to help us meet that goal. However, in the age of COVID-19, it does not appear that we will be able to meet that self-imposed obligation to WARM simply by planning a Dine-to-donate event to raise the funds. Therefore, it is the decision of the Mission Board that we will ask for monetary donations from the congregation to help us meet that goal. We have agreed to suspend all other mission projects until we have the \$1200 needed to send to WARM in January 2021.


Please send your checks directly to the church or place them in the offering plates. The checks should be made out directly to the church with a notation that the funds will go to the WARM Dinner Mission.
