Points for Reflection

Welcome to my Advent Sermon Series on hymns and how they inform and deepen our faith and understanding of Christmas. Each week you are invited to read through the week's focus scripture and reflect on some questions to guide your thoughts on the text, and to consider how the biblical text connects with the hymn's verses. This week's text: Luke 1:39-56

- □ This beautiful text appears in Luke just after Mary's encounter with the Angel Gabriel and before she leaves to visit her cousin Elizabeth. This text is known as *The Magnificat*. Read through it to see if you can figure out why.
- □ Unlike the text we read last week, these verses are almost always a part of our Advent and Christmas celebrations. What do they tell us about the baby Mary is to bear?
- □ What does this text say about joy? Who is joyful in this text? Why?
- \Box Which line of the hymn do you think captures the essence of this biblical text?

Luke 1:39-56

In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'

And Mary said,

'My soul magnifies the Lord,

and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant.

Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed;

for the Mighty One has done great things for me,

and holy is his name.

His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.
He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.
He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly;
he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.
He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever.'

And Mary remained with her for about three months and then returned to her home.
