The Beacon January 2021



"Today's trouble is enough for today." Matthew 6:34b

In light of what we witnessed transpire in our nation's capital this past Wednesday, Jesus' wisdom as expressed in this snippet from the Sermon on Mount seems the best advice I can think to offer. What we witnessed was something I think we are all still struggling to process – an attack on the Capital itself, egged on by the President of the United States desperate to hold on to power no matter. I know we try to keep overtly political conversations outside the church walls, but this act was so heinous, so egregious, so frightening, that it transcends mere politics. To ignore it would make me feel complicit in a seditious act.

We are a rarity in the United Church of Christ these days as a church with a flag in the sanctuary, on the chancel no less. Many of our sister churches have removed their flags entirely or moved them to more inobtrusive locations. I am grateful that we have not. Its presence in our midst makes sense because it was our UCC forefathers and foremothers in the Massachusetts Bay Colony who laid the foundations on which this country was built. Our church and our ability to worship as we choose, surrounded as we are by much more theologically conservative churches, exists because of that flag. I also believe we are citizens of this country as well as practicing Christians who live here and the flag is a powerful and visible reminder of that. Jesus calls us to live our faith into reality every day, not relegating it to the shelf to be dusted off just on Sunday mornings. So, I feel as aggrieved as a pastor as I am as a citizen by what happened Wednesday. I have no intent of detailing what led to the explosion of violence in DC. We know what caused it, and who. The question before us now is, ironically, the question I had imagined we would be struggling with as this new year begins with a Pandemic raging out of control and our economy struggling.

That question is, how do we heal and move on? How do we acknowledge the pain and fear and worry and anxiety that has been dogging us every day since last March in a way that will enable us to move forward into God's future? We all were hurting before we witnessed the core of our democracy under attack on Wednesday. That was literally adding insult to pre-existing injury. Yet, life goes on. We go on, hurting and fear-filled though we may be. This is why I decided to spend this time in Epiphanytide – the liturgical season between Christmas and the beginning of Lent – by focusing on healing. The sermon topics for each Sunday follow this article and I hope they pique your interest! Also, I would love to hear your questions, your concerns, your thoughts about any of them as we move forward in our ponderings on healing together.

So, dear ones, as we face these challenging days together – the remaining days until the Inauguration and all the days to follow – let us remember to pray each day for this beautiful country that we so love. Let us pray for her leaders and all of her people, the ones we love and the ones we don't, the ones we know and the ones we'll never meet. Let us pray for our wonderful church that we may be the shining beacon of hope we aspire to be always. Let us pray that in this sacred season of Epiphany the healing light and love of Jesus will infiltrate every trembling heart and guide us into the future God is counting on us to create together.

Trustee Notes

Trustee Notes

Due to the increase in the number of Covid 19 Virus infections; Sunday morning worship in the sanctuary has been suspended. During the week the church facility is open for administrative purposes only. This means that only employees and others conducting church business (financial and maintenance) are allowed in the building. No visitors are allowed in the building. If you do have a need to enter the facility, please remember to sign in and out on the forms at each entrance and to use the hand sanitizer and sanitizing

wipes. We have completed our fall inspections and servicing:

- The fire alarm system was serviced and tested. There is a water leak at the end of the middle hallway that is getting into the pull station on the wall. The leak appears to be coming from where the landing outside the door in the upper hallway meets the building. This area will be cleaned and caulked when warmer weather returns. Meanwhile we will keep an eye on this pull station during the winter months.
- We passed the Fire Marshall inspection. He recommended that emergency lighting be installed in each of the bathrooms. We will schedule this work as funds become available.

We are seeking quotes on the following maintenance projects:

- Replacement of the cracked cross windows
- Re-shingling the slanted roofs

We want to thank all who have been able to give generously to financially support the church. We understand that some may be unemployed (hopefully only temporarily) or have had a reduction in their income. As of the end of November we have received \$59,056 in pledges, \$5,529 (8%) less than the anticipated amount of \$64585. The total income was \$97,134. Thanks to the Paycheck Protection Program loan to cover employee salaries during the Covid-19 Pandemic, our total expenses were only \$102,484, \$2,005 less than the budgeted amount of \$104,489. Our current deficit is \$5,350

If you have not submitted a pledge for 2021 please do so as soon as possible. The next Trustee meeting will be on January 14, 2021 at 6:30 PM. We will be finalizing the 2021 budget at that time.



From the Financial Secretary

Greetings to all... Here are a few notes for 2021.

Please continue to use the same Pledge Number (found on the upper right corner of pledge envelopes) for the new year. You can place that number in the Memo line of your check. Do not worry if you do not know your number or if you pledge electronically. We can look up your number/name very easily. If you usually use pledge envelopes, please know that we will hold these at church until such time that we can worship together again. Perhaps making a note on your calendar each time you send in a contribution will help you keep pledges relatively current.

The Assistant Financial Secretaries, Ed Stratton and Bill Street will continue to "process and categorize" the pledges and other monies that come into church and then make a deposit about every two weeks or so. I will then go in and record the pledges on the computer for your statements. Know that there could be delays between when you send in checks and when they are deposited. Year-end financial statements will be mailed out in early January. They will reflect your 2020 donations.

A wise member of our congregation suggested that our financial statements should reflect any donations we make through the church, such as for our Monthly Mission Drives. Such offerings, although they do not go directly to our church or the UCC's Five for Five mission collections, are still made in the name of our church. This was a very sound observation! Beginning in 2021, I will endeavor to record any monetary Mission donation you make on your financial statements. If you ever donate simply CASH, and wish to have the Mission donation recorded in your statement, please put it in an envelope with your name/mission destination on it and we will be sure to record it. You can also make Mission donations through the new on-line giving option on our church's website! All on-line donations will be recorded on your statement.

In the next Beacon, I would like to feature a step-by-step simple tutorial about how to make an on-line donation.




UPDATE! UCCW Pandemic Response Team
