# The Beacon October 2021



"... but Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs."" Matthew 19:14

Make no mistake, this is undoubtedly one of the most important verses in the Gospels. And it's always been one of my favorites. For the 20 years I served as a Minister of Christian Education and Family Life, I had it framed in my office and centered on the bulletin board outside my office - the one with the latest information on all the many offerings for the month which this very large CE program in a large church was able to offer. In its heydey, this program had 150+ children registered in Nursery through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. We had a staff of 32 teachers and assistants. This same church also offered three youth groups, one for kids in the older elementary grades, one for middle school kids and lastly for senior high kids. I was also responsible for a family life event each month, ranging from Jack-O-Lantern carving contests to the Christmas pageant to Mardi Gras, etc. This program was truly the epitome of what every church envisions their programs for children and youth to be. I loved every minute of it. But time moves on and people and situations change. This church changed and this program is now a fraction of the size it once was. I changed, deciding to take my vocation in ministry in a whole new direction putting me on the path which led to my serving here as your pastor. God is good. All the time.

So why I am writing about this today? Because I see our church on the threshold of a new beginning made manifest in our magnificently rejuvenated and repaired Cross Window. As we dedicated it last Sunday, we were all awe-struck by how breath-taking it is, how it plays with the light in the sanctuary illuminating one corner and then another, how it requires us to look out into God's world as we worship together in the safety of our sanctuary. The simple truth is, dear ones, that life is changing - moving ahead in ways we never imagined before Covid and everything else that has come with it. The world now visible in a whole new way outside our magnificent cross window has changed dramatically in the last 18+ months and it will never be the same again. And neither will we.

So the question for us as God's Beloved Community gathered here in our church becomes who do we dare imagine God needs us to be in this whole new reality within which our church now finds itself? That is both a terrifying question and an exciting one. God is clearly inviting us to consider doing a new thing, but what and how and when is not yet clear. Just like the Cross Window before it was replaced, our vision has been shuttered and frosted over without us fully realizing it. But now we can see clearly and God's invitation to us to join in whatever God is doing in these days is slowly being revealed.

Back to this favorite verse of mine. This is not, as some like to think, a simple rebuke of the disciples by Jesus for demeaning children as unimportant. Of course, that is true but this little verse is so much more. It's a powerful reminder to all of us from Jesus himself that we all need to become as children in responding to God's love. We must love without fear, even people and situations which frighten us. We must trust that God knows what God is doing and we must recognize anew each day God's invitation to each of us to be part of God's evolving plan for the world. How exciting is that!! #### LIFTING UP HOPE FOR HAITI

As we have heard in news reports and read in the newspapers, the nation of Haiti has been hit again by both an earthquake and a hurricane. Devastation covers the island. One of the recurring issues for Haiti is that it always gets bumped off the headlines and out of our awareness by the next crisis and this year is no exception with hurricanes and the plight of Afghan refugees to name just a few. This is why during the months of September and October we are conducting a fund-raising drive to help this impoverished country. The Rhode Island Association of the SNEUCC has a longstanding mission on the ground in Haiti which is why we know that any funds we give to this group will go directly to Haiti for direct assistance where it is needed most. The only way to do this is through cash donations so that is what we are doing. A display "Lifting Up Hope for Haiti" is located just outside the sanctuary doors leading to Fellowship Hall where you can pick up a "Hope for Haiti" little gift box to fill with your coins and dollar bills over the next 8 weeks. If 30 people give just \$2/week (\$16 total) between now and the end of October, that will give us \$500 to send to Haiti. It may not

sound like a lot to us, but it can make a world of difference in a country in the midst of chaos and devastation. Please join us in bringing a little hope to people who need it most.

Thanks go out to everyone who has donated to date.



We remain concerned about our local neighbors and can reassure you that we are still collecting donations of non-perishable food supplies for the PNC. They have supplied a list of the most needed foods: canned meats and fish, canned soups (clam chowder, in particular), healthy cereals and oatmeal, canned fruit. Please try to find the easy open cans, if possible. Little cups of fruit are also great for school lunches.

As many of you know, our church takes pride in our involvement in the "Five for Five" donations collected yearly nationally through the UCC. It is that time of the year for the Neighbors In Need collection, which we will be accepting through Sunday, October 31. **Neighbors In Need** supports the UCC ministries of justice and compassion with the current focus being on racial justice and refugee concerns. We will have the opportunity to purchase blankets, either lightweight or heavy weight, that will be sent through-out the United States and overseas. The blankets cost \$10 each, but feel free to donate whatever you can afford. For every blanket purchased we will be placing a heart on the Mission Christmas Tree in the sanctuary. Donations will be accepted in envelopes that will be supplied in church, through the mail, or on-line. You will be able to view the blankets on a display in Fellowship Hall as we get closer to the holidays. # Trustee Notes

The church facilities are now open for visitors and group activities. We respectfully request that any person not fully vaccinated to please wear a mask when in the building. Please continue to sign in and out on the forms at each entrance and to use the hand sanitizer and sanitizing wipes. Pledges continue to come in at a higher rate than expected. As of August, we have received \$45,732 in pledges. This is \$4,974 (7%) more than the \$40,758 that was budgeted. We wish to thank everyone for keeping up with their pledges during the first 8 months. Our total income through August was \$88,411. Total expenses through August were \$102,984. This leaves us with a deficit of \$14,572. This is primarily due to some badly needed repairs to the church building including the new roofs over the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall and replacement of the Cross window.

The Trustees will be sponsoring a Fall cleanup on Saturday, October 23, from 9:00 to 12:00. Coffee, water and donuts will be provided. We are going to concentrate on cleaning the inside of the church this year. Please bring your mops, buckets, rags, paper towels, and cleaning supplies so the we can attack the following chores:

- Sweep, vacuum, and mop all hallway floors
- Remove cobwebs in all hallways and rooms
- Wash windows at the end of the hallways
- Wash windows and dust window sills in middle and lower-level rooms
- Vacuum middle and lower-level rooms
- Clean stairwell storage area
- Wash windows in crib room
- Mop Fellowship Hall floor



The next Trustee meeting will be on October 19.

#### Update on the Cross Widow

We have a new Cross Window and the sanctuary is bright with God's light. Clinton Glass installed a new dark bronze anodized aluminum frame and 1" clear tempered insulated glass September 22. A big thanks to Alan Hill (Asael's son) and his crew for removing the old wooden cross, repairing water leaks, and preparing the opening with new wood.

Total cost for replacing the window was \$11,578. The final cost for the glass was \$4,250 and the aluminum framing was \$7,328. We have received approximately

\$8,546 in donations to help pay for the project. We will gladly receive additional donations to help cover this unexpected expense.

The bottom 4 feet of the wooden cross was rotted out as well as some of the arms and top. It is in the back parking and we will try and save as much as possible and clean it up to hang again.
