"In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. Luke 2:1

These are the familiar words that begin the Nativity Story – the first Christmas story. What do either of these have to do with the peace on earth the angels at the manger promised? Don't get me wrong, I enjoy these songs as much as the next person yet I still grieve the role they play in obscuring Baby Jesus from our sight and our hearing.

So, this Advent and Christmas season, I invite you to join me in slowing down this year, taking care to really watch for and listen to that original Christmas story whenever it becomes visible. Join us for Sunday worship, online or in-person or both! Brave the cold evening air to confront the challenges this season brings to folks who are hurting as we gather for our annual Blue Christmas service. Bring a piece of your own nativity or creche set to our Christmas Eve service so it can be blessed for your family celebrations at home.

Dear ones, there is so much more to Christmas that what we usually settle for. Give yourself a real gift this year and invest in that original Christmas story, the one whose very opening words remind us that the world Baby Jesus was born into is not so very different from the one we have to live in each day.

May the shining light and sweet love emanating from the newborn Babe in the Manger fill your lives and your hearts with healing, hope and joy this Christmas Season.

#### Bazaar:

Many thanks to all the bakers, makers, movers, creators, donators, setter-uppers and all others who have helped make our bazaars a success. Our flexibility has enabled us to alter plans weekly as the weather changes. There is a good chance we will at least match last year's income. There have been so many positive comments from our shoppers, many of whom have visited us multiple weeks.

### Exploring Some Changes with The Chancel Flowers

In addition to assisting Rev. Ruth with all the special worship services during this Advent season, the Deacons are always considering ways to make our worship experiences as meaningful as possible. We have found that sometimes it's the smallest details that can make a huge difference!

One such detail has been the flowers in the vases flanking the altar each week. Some of you are probably aware that the quality of flowers we have been receiving each week has gone steadily downhill for about the past six months. In checking around for other possible florists to oversee this for us, we discovered that the cheapest price we could get two vases of flowers for would be \$50 per vase! We currently pay McQuades \$30 for two vases. Clearly that price is no longer sustainable.

So, after much careful conversation within Deacons and with folks who regularly order flowers for Sunday worship, we are proposing some changes for the Chancel Flowers beginning January 1. Please note this is on a trial basis to see how it works! No final decision has been made! Here is the proposed new Chancel Flowers system:

- If you would like to have fresh flowers in church one Sunday, you must first reserve the date (like now) on the Flower Calendar in Fellowship Hall. Kindly note you are also asked to plan to take the flowers at the end of the service.
- Then, you order the flowers you would like from the florist of your choice and pay for them directly. This allows you to control both the cost and the colors. You may bring them yourself on Sunday morning (arriving by 9:15am) OR you may make arrangements to have them delivered at a time convenient to church staff.
- During the spring, summer and fall months, you may also bring in your own fresh flowers from your gardens on a date you have reserved.
- On the weeks when no flowers will be present based on the Flower Chart,

the Deacons will have high quality silk floral arrangements for the vases.

So, that's the plan! Please speak with any Deacon to let us know what you think! Thanks!

## **Holiday Donation Drive Change**



Well, we are nothing if not flexible! Our plan for our Holiday Donation Drive to collect money to purchase survival blankets is now put on hold until January because there is an urgent need in our very own community. We received a plea from the Jonnycake Center for gift cards and monetary donations to help our neighbors in need. They are NOT requesting gifts or toys, although other agencies in town are. They are requesting gift cards to local stores, so that parents can experience the joy of purchasing gifts for their own children. Parents know exactly what their kiddos need/want and are aware of current sizes. We are suggesting cards to Walmart, CVS, Walgreens, Stop and Shop, or McQuade's. The cards to the drug stores and grocery stores will "free up" a family's resources to enable them to purchase gifts.

There is a special box on the display table at the entrance to the sanctuary. Kindly deposit your gift cards and/or monetary donations there. A member of the Mission Board will deliver the week's donations every Monday, so that Jonnycake can distribute them as soon as possible.



We remain concerned about our local neighbors and can reassure you that we are still collecting donations of non-perishable food supplies for the PNC. They have supplied a list of the most needed foods: canned meats and fish, canned soups (clam chowder, in particular), healthy cereals and oatmeal, canned fruit. Please try to find the easy open cans, if possible. Little cups of fruit are also great for school lunches.
