Admittedly this event is my baby, my brainchild, grounded in the Homeless Awareness Vigils of youth groups of the 1990's, a staple of youth ministry and Confirmation classes at that time. Over the years, and especially in this time of Covid, these Vigils have gone the way of so many other church programs and been relegated to memory or "remember when" nostalgia moments in churches throughout the country. Understandable except for one thing. The Homelessness Crisis is rapidly moving beyond a Crisis to a full blown Catastrophe and yet no viable solutions are on the horizon. Dear ones, our communities MUST do something to address this need and the first step in doing that is to bring attention to the crisis and that is what this year's candlelight prayer vigil in our own upper parking lot this Saturday hopes to do. My colleagues from local churches are coming as are human service agency staff and hopefully even more folks from our church and the neighborhood. So, here is my ask: Please come and bring your kids and your neighbors, anyone you can think of.

Help us to light a candle in the darkness as we invite God into problem-solving mode with us. An hour of your time. Dear ones, that is literally the least we can do. Hope to see you there.

Wait times for affordable or low-income housing are 12-24 months at a minimum. This is simply not sustainable for those in dire need. There are no easy answers, but we do know it will take the community coming together to make a lasting difference. Please join us in a simple first step: this candlelight Prayer Vigil being held outside in solidarity with those who have no warm homes. There will be prayers, songs, and stories. All are welcome! Please give up an hour of time to show you care for the least of these!

### **MISSION MOMENTS - February**





Our food donation drive collecting non-perishable food and living closet supplies for the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center will continue through the end of March as the need is strong. Help us "bury the altar" in food donations! Most needed items:

- · Canned fish and meats
- Meat-based canned soups/stews
- Nut butters
- Bags or cans of dried beans and peas
- Whole-grain cereals

- Bags of plain rice and pasta
- Barley and quinoa
- · Canned fruits in fruit juice or light syrup
- Canned vegetables
- Dish detergent
- Larger sized diapers
- Hygiene supplies
- Paper products, such as toilet tissue

Donations should be brought to church and left in the red buckets at the Bell Courtyard door. Donations brought with you to worship should be placed directly on the altar before worship or during the first hymn. If you can't make it to church, you can easily order food and hygiene items on Amazon and have them delivered directly to the PNC.

In future months we are looking for opportunities to support new projects and programs in our area as well as those with a global reach. Our next project will be raising funds along with our ecumenical partners in the United Methodist Church who are collaborating with UNICEF to finance the distribution of Covid vaccines to poor countries around the world. We will gratefully accept donations in any amount. Check out the display in the Bell Courtyard Narthex on April 1! Note: Every \$37 raised provides 2 vaccine shots to 10 people!



**Trustee Notes** 

End Of the year pledges came in at a higher rate than expected. For 2021 we received \$67,181 in pledges. This is \$6,044 (10%) more than the \$61,137 that was budgeted. We wish to thank everyone for keeping up with their pledges during the year. Our total income for 2021 was \$143,079. Total expenses for the year were \$152,790. This left us with a deficit of

\$9,711 which is significantly less than the approved deficit of \$17,626.

The Trustees have prepared a 2022 budget. Estimated income for 2022 is \$112,968. Estimated expenses are \$116,854. This is a deficit of \$3,886 for 2022. The proposed 2022 budget will be presented to the congregation for approval at the next Annual Meeting. If you have not submitted your 2022 pledge, please do so as soon as possible.

Coast and Country Landscaping was selected as the contractor for snow plowing. This is the same contractor as last year and they will keep the same pricing as last year. The Trustees are also looking into a plaque commemorating the dedication of the new cross window and for a safe for the office.

The next Trustee meeting will be on February 16 at 6:30.



The Pandemic Response Team wishes to thank everyone for their patience and support as we made the decision to implement a temporary pause on in-person worship at the beginning of January. We are very happy to announce that with current infection numbers falling, we are moving forward with our plans to return to in-person worship on Sunday, February 20. For the time being, however, Fellowship time will take place in the sanctuary with masks. We hope to lift this restriction soon. 


