Bakers needed each week - this is such a popular area that folks come for. All kinds of baked goods needed.
Ask Carolyn & Shirin about prices for your goods so that task can be done ahead of time.

- Artificial wreaths & trees are ready to be decorated. All materials are organized in the last room on the middle level.

- For the December 3rd date, fresh greens arrangements are needed. Containers & supplies are also in that room.

- Also for December 3rd, we will need lots of Christmas cookies for our Christmas cookie plates, which were a huge hit last year. If you bake ahead of time & freeze,

wrap securely. There is room in the freezers in our kitchen.

- We will also need large & small/medium plates to put the cookies on. These can be Christmas-y, glass, or other decorative plates.

- Lots of hands will be needed before and on each of those bazaar dates to assist with set-up, sales, money collection, customer service, delivery to shoppers' cars, & pack up at the end of each day.

- Prayers & crossed fingers for good weather so we can host both inside and out. We know we are flexible & creative and will accommodate whatever comes our way, and all our hard work throughout the year will be appreciated and will benefit our church.

Trustee Notes

Pledges through September were \$49,890, \$2969 less than the anticipated amount of \$52,859. Total income through September was \$384,048. (This figure reflects the \$300,551 Sicilian endowment bequest which has been dispersed to the Endowment Fund at Professional Planning). Our actual income was \$83,497, \$1818 less than the anticipated \$85,315. Expenses for September were \$89,200, \$986 more than the anticipated expenses of \$88,214. \$3098.00 was received for the organ fund through donations and the art show. Thanks to everyone for continuing with their pledges during the year! The outside water faucet by Fellowship Hall has been replaced. The cross memorial plaque is in the final stage of production!
