"The Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted forty days and forty nights..." Matthew 4:1-2

Lent begins this month. This ancient Christian tradition dates back millennia and began as a time of study and preparation for persons interested in becoming Christian and joining a faith community. The idea of Lent comes from the story of Jesus going out into the wilderness immediately following his baptism, for a period of solitude, prayer and reflection before he began his active years of ministry. He fasted for these 40 days which is where the idea of observing some kind of ritual abstinence – giving up a favorite food, meatless Fridays, etc. – originated.

Our 40 days of Lent, which excludes Sundays by the way, begins with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. On that day, I will be offering for the first time "Drive-Through" ashes in the upper parking lot from approximately 5-5:30pm in the hopes of catching some folks on their way home from work. Our usual Ash Wednesday service will take place at 6pm in the sanctuary.

I will also be offering a special Lenten Book Study this year for four Sundays after church in person and online. Check the article for more details. Additionally, I will be providing a personal Lenten Guide with suggestions on how you might want to consider using this Lenten season as a special time to reconnect with Jesus, with your faith and the deeper meaning of being Christian. May your Lenten journey this year be a rich one!

Pledges through December were \$69,447, \$1031 less than the anticipated amount of \$70,478. Total income for December was \$128,388. Expenses for December were \$137,352 \$19,733 more than the anticipated expenses of \$117,619. We ended the year with a deficit of \$8963. Thanks again to everyone who has pledged for the upcoming year!

MISSION MOMENTS February

The Missions Board met in January and did some planning for the months ahead. Our weekly support of the food pantry at the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center (PNC) will continue each Sunday throughout the year allowing everyone to support it as makes sense for them. Our other specific focus for February is on homelessness and our support of the WARM Center. Please check out the other article on the Homeless Awareness Prayer Vigil planned for Saturday, Feb. 18. We are also collecting donations to offset part of the cost of our annual pledge of \$1200 to WARM for its soup kitchen operations. During Lent we will once again be inviting folks to support the Church World Service organization as we hold a Blanket Drive in March and April. Following that will be the return of the "Babies and Ladies" donation drive in May & June followed by our now familiar "In the Middle" School Supplies drive in July & August.

Please know your Missions Board is keenly aware of the danger of "over-asking" for donations and other support for our many initiatives. Implicit in every request is always the realization that we know everyone has limits and that each of us does what we can, as we can, to support worthy causes here in the church and elsewhere. Put another way, we are keenly aware that "no one can do everything" but we hope "everyone can do something" even if it's only one thing. Thank you for all YOU do!




FEBRUARY DONATION DRIVE

Organ Fund

On behalf of the Organ Committee, and as Financial Secretary, I'd like to provide an update on "where we are" with funds needed to complete the repairs and refurbishment of our Wicks Pipe Organ. We have signed a contract with the well-respected Foley-Baker Company to complete this work, which will begin this spring and should be completed by the end of December, roughly. There will be a period of time when the organ will not be playable, and David Cranmer will use the Arlene Ainsworth piano to accompany worship services. At last year's Annual Meeting, the congregation voted to make the needed repairs and to honor the \$92,046 total bill.

There has been a modest Organ Account in existence for many years, funded by former (deceased) member Lois Ledbetter for organ

maintenance. The congregation also decided that this account could be used to fund the current repairs. From this account, a \$4800 deposit was paid to Foley-Baker.

Since the need for repairs became known, several very thoughtful members have made substantial donations to the Organ Fund. The family of Judy Bartlett also decided that funds given to the church in her memory be allocated to the Organ Fund. Our industrious members have already completed fundraisers to benefit the Fund: The Congregational Life Committee organized the Bob and June Sicilian Art Show and Sale, which raised over \$3,000. The Barrie Estate Sale (Linda Evans' friend) raised close to \$4,000. Janet Allen sold ceramic ornaments at the Christmas Bazaar to add to the Organ Fund. Thank you to everyone for your generous donations and hard work! In addition, The Washington Trust Bank recently awarded the church a \$1,000 Charitable Trust Grant for the repair of the organ! The total of all the above income is \$31,019.11, approximately one-third of the total cost!

The Organ Committee has discussed several fundraising ideas for the year ahead. The first one will likely be an easy one: a Potluck Soup Supper at the church, with donations to benefit the Organ Fund. We hope to get that on the calendar very soon. Other ideas are; Coffee House afternoons featuring our own musicians (Allana Allik has kindly offered to organize this venue!), a Poetry Reading, a Bridge Party, and a Comedy Evening.

The congregation can be assured that even if we do not cover the entire amount owed in 2023, we will be able to meet the obligation using other funds, perhaps some of the Bob and June Sicilian Bequest, and then continue to fundraise in 2024 to replace as much as possible. Therefore, 2023 is "The Year of the Organ!"

The Organ Committee would also like to invite UCC members who have not already done so to consider making a donation to the Organ Fund in any amount. A larger donation could be made as a pledge and paid over time. Using an honor system, a member could mentally "pledge" to give a certain amount by year's end and divide up the payments as personal budgets dictate. Be sure to note "Organ Fund" on every donation made so that your financial team is able to deposit every donation and allocate it properly.

To keep track of our progress, I will place poster in Fellowship Hall, showing our current total and future growth toward the goal amount. Since we as a church elected to make the organ repairs, we can support his work in whatever way we are able.


