Hard as it is to believe, Lent arrives in the week ahead! Our season to reflect on who we are in relationship with God is upon us. Also coming up is our Threshold Retreat as we gather together to consider how we envision our church in five years, ten and beyond! So it would seem this year that an intentional time of self-reflection as individuals and as a congregation is especially important.

Our Lenten observance will begin on Wednesday, February 14 with Ash Wednesday. Ironic that it coincides with Valentines Day! Seems to me that this is a pretty clear invitation from God to approach Lent a little differently – not so much giving something up (like chocolate \textcircled) but instead taking something on. What might that be? That's up to you! It could be spending a few extra minutes each day in silent meditation using the Breath of 10. It could mean making a point of reading the Scriptures more intentionally. For example, you could try to read through the entire Gospel of John during Lent, writing down your questions and observations. How is John similar to the other Gospels? How is it different? Fun to think about!

You can also make the effort to attend worship in person every Sunday, and maybe take a risk and bring a friend! Wouldn't that be cool? Whatever you decide to do, the whole point is to make a sincere effort to invest in yourself by investing in learning more about the faith you profess. Who knows? You might just like it!


