"As Samuel grew up, the Lord was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground." 1 Samuel 3:19

"Summertime and the livin' is easy" or so say the lyrics from that famous song from the 1959 film Porgy & Bess. At least this is the version I am most familiar with. However, Porgy & Bess began it's first stage run as an opera written by composer George Gershwin. It was first performed in Boston on September 30, 1935, before opening on Broadway in New York, performed by a classically trained all black cast. This was one thing Gershwin insisted on as he licensed the rights for the opera to be performed by various theatrical companies. He thus launched the careers of several black performers who got their big breaks in these performances. Gershwin's caveat soon brought racial controversy from both whites and blacks. White composers like Virgil Thomson thought that "the American Negro" was not capable of speaking for him/herself and therefore did not deserve to have these prime roles in a hit production limited to them. On the other hand, it was rumored that some blacks thought the depictions of "Negroes" were caricatures of what white composers thought they would sound like. Yikes! Negativity is endemic to the human condition, or so it seems!

This seeming inability for people just to be kind to each other is why I've created a plan for exploring some of the arts during our summer worship experiences. I'll be guiding us through reflections on various books, one television series and one movie so that we can explore more deeply the intersection between culture and our Christian faith as a progressive congregation. The various cultural reference points I'll be using appear in the Sunday morning worship schedule descriptions of the plans

for each Sunday so that if you want to read the book or view the television series in advance, you'll be able to do so. Note: I won't be speaking on the movie until August 11 but if you're curious enough to watch it now, it's *Bridge of Spies* starring Tom Hanks. More on that in the *August/September Beacon*!

I confess I have always loved the arts and I know how much depth and meaning they can and do add to our experiences of faith on Sunday mornings and, truthfully, throughout every aspect of our lives. God is always speaking, as we in the UCC embrace so well. But sometimes we miss God's voice because we're looking for something neatly packaged and labeled as "church" or "faithfulness" rather than God's subtle whispers all around us, taking so many different forms.

So, I hope you will enjoy this summertime excursion with me into the arts. As we make our way forward, my prayer is that God blesses us with the great gift he gave to the young Samuel – that none of his words fell to the ground where they would be forgotten, ignored, trampled into dust. May we experience together that truly, God is always with us, always guiding us, always revealing new possibilities, new dreams and new ways of moving forward together. May our words, especially the kind ones, never fall to the ground, unheard and unheeded.

The music for August 2 will be provided by 2 Cat Zoo.




UCCW LADIES WHO LUNCH
