Trustees Notes

Pledges for April were \$5,143, \$839 less than the anticipated pledge amount of \$5,982. Total income for April was \$13,164. Total expenses for April were \$13,920.

New Trash Collection

As most of you are probably aware there is a new trash pickup service in Stonington. In January, the Town's contracted trash hauler, Mr. Frank Crandall of F.E. Crandall Disposal, notified the Town he had retired and CWPM, LLC had taken over his contracts, equipment and personnel.

The traditional collection method that was utilized by F.E. Crandall Disposal has become obsolete. CWPM utilizes carts for effective trash collection. Carts were distributed to residents in early April and we noted that the church did not receive carts. We contacted the Stonington Solid Waste Department and were informed that since we are not a residential property, we are not eligible for the new collection service. Therefore, we had to contract for commercial trash collection.

The Trustees contracted with Casella for our trash disposal. They supplied us with two carts;

the black one is for trash and the blue one is for recyclables. The carts are located outside the kitchen door. Casella will collect our trash once per month at the cost of \$16.85 per month (\$10.28 for trash and \$6.57 for recyclables). Our pick-up day is the second Tuesday of the month.

Please note that we do not have to use the yellow Stonington bags anymore. Regular trash bags can be used. The list of recyclable material has not changed. All trash and recyclables should be placed in the carts and not kept in the kitchen area.




Card & Game Party Tuesday. June 17 @ 1pm

Bazaar Pantry Already? Yup!



Yes, believe it or not, even though summer has barely begun, UCC bakers and canners are already hard at work—making and prepping jams, jellies, pickles, relishes, butters, and more! It's shaping up to be a busy summer as we

prepare for our two bazaars this fall.

We'll be filling dozens upon dozens of canning jars, using more pounds of sugar and bottles of



vinegar than
we can count,
and chopping
up heaps of
fresh fruits
and
vegetables —

some even grown in our own gardens. We're also stocking our freezers with fruits and vegetables to use in baking and soup making later. And all of this happens before the baking even begins! Boggles the mind, doesn't it?

In past years, some of you have mentioned that you're unable to bake for the bazaars or don't have the time. We all know our customers expect homemade goods—not store-bought—so how can you still help? Contributing to our bazaar pantry would be a huge support! A list of our baking needs is included at the end of this article.

Don't worry if we receive more of an item than we can use this year. If it has an extended expiration date, we'll save it for next year or donate it to the PNC in January. While you're out shopping, grab any sale items from our list and drop them in the designated basket in Fellowship Hall or the kitchen, labeled for the bazaar pantry. We'll store them in plastic tubs in the kitchen closet so our bakers, soup makers, and canners can access them when they fire up their canners, soup pots, or ovens.

Have extra frozen fruits or vegetables to share? No problem! Just place them in the kitchen freezer and label them for the bazaar. It's that easy—no sign-ups, no stress.

Thank you so much for any help you can provide—you have no idea how much we appreciate it!

And, by the way, please return your empty jars from last year!

Bazaar Pantry Shopping List

(*** = Needed now)

Dry Goods

- o ***Granulated sugar
- o Light Brown sugar
- o Dark Brown sugar
- o Confectioners' sugar
- Molasses

- Vegetable oil
- o Solid Crisco
- o Peanut butter
- Chocolate chips (also white, butterscotch, peanut butter, and cinnamon chips)
- o Cocoa—regular and dark
- o ***Cider vinegar
- o Flour (King Arther preferred)
- GF Flour (Bob's Red Mill 1 to 1 Baking Flour or King Arthur Measure for Measure GF Flour)
- o Pecans and Walnuts

Refrigerated items

- Butter (unsalted and salted)—please wrap lightly and place in the freezer
- Plant butter (Earth Balance sticks)—same as above
- o Eggs—closer to the bazaar

Packaging

- o Plastic clamshells
- Cardboard pie boxes
- Plastic quart and pint-sized soup containers
- ***Glass Mason jars—quart, pint, half pint, and jelly jars*** (with lids if possible)
