



"For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it [for] it will surely come. Habakkuk 2:3

This beautiful text from Habakkuk is actually one of the lectionary readings for this week, and it is amazingly timely. As we go to press on this, much is uncertain in the face of a government shutdown making our already anxious lives feel even more fretful and worrisome. In these verses, Habakkuk a prophet - is reminding us that there is still a vision, a plan, for the time we are living through. Even if we can't see it and perhaps don't even quite trust it, we can be sure it is still there, still unfolding and will continue to do so. Why can we know this? Because the plan is God's. God's plan is still working itself out, right here in our midst as a church and in our individual persons and families. I realize those words are not necessarily much comfort, but they are still true. Our work in the church in this moment is to remind one another of God's presence and God's truth always revealing itself in surprising ways. We may not always be able to see it, Habakkuk tells us. But it's still there, waiting for God's time to reveal itself. Habakkuk knows how difficult this is for us because he tells us quite directly, "if it seems to tarry, wait for it" because it will surely come.

Well, we sure hope so. But it still doesn't make these anxious days any less anxious, does it. Still, we are here and part of this faith community where we can turn for comfort and support and, most importantly, hope. That dear friends is truly gift and blessing that never goes away.

This reminder of the church's role in our lives and in the community is what is at the root of this Sunday's ALL BOARDS meeting in Fellowship Hall following worship. We will meet at 11:15am for a very specific and targeted conversation about how it is we, as this church we love, will be organizing ourselves to continue to do God's work in our community. Kindly note that I will be sending out a mailing shortly with an agenda and a plan for our time together. My original hope was that this would be a longer meeting, perhaps with a meal, but it became obvious that just would not work with folks' schedules at this time. But that does not change how very important this meeting, this conversation, is as we reflect together on our church in the future. Everyone serving on a board, plus all committees and teams are invited and strongly encouraged to come. Everyone not currently serving in one of those capacities is also encouraged to come. I am confident you will find it to be an hour and 15 minutes well invested. Thank you in advance for coming.

If you have any questions or comments, please don't hesitate to speak with Rev. Ruth at any time.



In years past some of you lamented that you are no longer able or do not have the time to bake or can for the bazaars, and we all know that our customers expect homemade goods, not store

bought. How can you still help? Well, contributing to our bazaar pantry would be ever so helpful. A list of our baking needs is included at the end of this article. Don't stress if we receive more of an item that we may use this year, as we can store it for next year (if it has an extended expiration date) or donate it to the PNC in January. When you are shopping, just grab anything on the list that may be on sale and put it in the designated basket in Fellowship Hall or in the kitchen and label it for the bazaar pantry; then, we will store it in the plastic tubs in the kitchen closet for our bakers, soup makers, and canners to access when they fire up their canners, soup pots, or ovens. Have extra frozen fruits or vegetables to share? No problem! Just place them in the freezer in the kitchen and label them for the bazaar. Easy peasy! No sign-ups or stress involved. Thanks so much for whatever help you can give us. You have no idea how much we will appreciate your donation. Here is an updated shopping list to help!

Dry Goods

- Granulated sugar
- Light Brown sugar
- Dark Brown sugar
- Confectioners' sugar
- Molasses
- Vegetable oil
- Solid Crisco, regular and butter flavored, in the can or sticks
- Peanut butter
- Chocolate chips (also white, butterscotch, peanut butter, and cinnamon chips)
- Cocoa—regular and dark
- Flour (King Arther preferred)
- GF Flour (Bob's Red Mill GF 1 to 1 Baking Flour or King Arthur Measure for Measure GF Flour)
- Pecans and Walnuts

Refrigerated items

- Butter (unsalted and salted)—please wrap lightly and place in the refrigerator
- Plant butter (Earth Balance sticks)—same as above
- Eggs, eggs, eggs!!!!

Packaging

Plastic clamshells
