DEACON'S WELCOME

CALL TO WORSHIP — Lighting of the Second Advent Candle of PEACE

Pastor: Today our journey through Advent continues. Last week we lit the Advent Candle of Hope. (*Re-light the candle*). This week more light is added as God's vision continues to spread.

Deacon: *From the book of Isaiah, chapter 9, verse 6: "For a child has been borne for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."*

One: We come to the Advent wreath today knowing that we are not perfect.

All: **We all make mistakes and do the wrong thing from time to time.**

One: Jesus knows our weaknesses as well as our strengths and still values each of us just as we are.

All: **To be fully known by Jesus, loved and cherished as we are is to find peace beyond understanding. This is how we are empowered to answer Jesus' call to live peace into our lives each day.**

(The Deacon lights the second candle, then leads the Unison Prayer)

Eternal God, we thank you that through all our struggles, you have always guided us toward the peace we need to live as you need us to live. From your peace we find the peace to be kind to others who are not themselves kind, to be just to others who are not just toward others themselves. May the peace we know in you enable us to guide others to your peace which passes all understanding.
